STRENUOUS TIME AT BORDEN.
Lieut. Abbott, O. C., Port Borden,
Camp and Mrs. Abbott spent a few
days in the city returning to Port
Borden Saturday. The camp consists
of fifty interned Germans and some
twenty returned soldiers who are
acting as Guards. The influenza epi-
demie struck the camp a hard blow,
eleven of the returned soldiers being
stricken of whom three died. The dif-
ficulties attending the care of the
sick were greatly accentuated during
the early stages of the epidemic by
the fact that the sick were housed in
cars where necessary comforts were
not available. This condition, how-
ever, was greatly relieved by the
kindness of Father John J. McDon-
ald and Father McIntyre who not only
converted their commodious paroch-
ial hall into a hospital but were un-
flinching in their attention to the
sick and to those in charge. Later the
services of Nursing Sisters Fitzgerald

and Compton greatly improved the
conditions not only in the temporary
hospital but in neighboring homes
where there were many cases of ex-
treme hardship, the hardship being
much increased by the fact that it
was impossible to secure help in the
neighborhood. Mrs. Abbott also gave
invaluable assistance taking upon
herself alternately the duties of nurse
and cook. Lieut. Abbott, who him-
self was seriously ill for several days
before help came, speaks in the high-
est terms of Nurses Fitzgerald and
Compton and their untiring devotion
to the sick many of whom undoubt-
edly owe their lives to the care they
received at their hands. The kindness
of Fathers J. J. McDonald and Mc-
Intyre, he says, he will never forget
nor will the men whom they so gener-
ously helped. Lieut. Abbott has now
fully recovered and resumes his mil-
itary duties today.
