Health Officer Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan in his report said that it was quite a healthy year for the city as regards infectious and contagious diseases there being only eight cases of scarlet fever and one of typhoid. This was due he said to the clean streets, sanitary sewerage system and good water supply. He touched on the recent outbreak of typhoid fever which was due mainly to regulations speedily put into force and to the commendable support of the citizens. He thanked Dr. Pethick, Dr. Croken, Dr. Lechie and the other veterinarians, the Chief of Police and Police Officers, the Sanitary Officer and the Free Dispensary for valuable assistance during the year. He reported that there were 258 deaths in the city for 1926.

In concluding he said that it was the best report in his experience. Councillor Yeo expressed his pleasure in moving the adoption of the report but said that tuberculosis cases were not handled in this city as they should be, fumigation and disinfection should be enforced after the death of a T. B. patient. Councillor Moran seconded the motion which was passed. Councillor Prowse then submitted the Financial Report the adoption of which after being read was moved by himself and Councillor Foster.
