



PRINCE ARTHUR'S TOUR IN CANADA

He Leaves Regina After a Jolly Day--Was Interested in the Horsemanship of the N. W. Mounted Police--He Was Very Much Pleased With the Horses.

REGINA, Sask., April 17.—After the luncheon at government house last week his honor the lieutenant-governor handed to Prince Arthur an engrossed copy of the speech from the throne at the opening of the legislature, which contains fitting reference to the visit of His Royal Highness and also the address of the legislative assembly, thanking His Majesty the King for his good wishes to the province on the occasion of the inauguration, asking him to present it to His Majesty on his return to England.

South Africa, Prince Arthur knows something of horse flesh, and he was especially delighted with the magnificent chargers which he saw at the barracks and on one of which he afterwards enjoyed a ride. The officers and their wives were presented and His Royal Highness also had long chat with Stan Sergeant Walters, who fought under his grandfather, the famous Red Prince in the Franco-Prussian war, winning the iron cross as a reward for his bravery. The prince and party were entertained at tea by Mrs. Commissioner Perry, who was assisted in her duties as hostess by Mrs. Heffernan and Mrs. Ritchie. Dinner was taken on the car, Premier Scott being one of His Highness's guests, and this concluded what the prince declared was one of the happiest days he had spent in Canada. The royal train is due to leave Regina at 7 on Thursday morning for Winnipeg en route to the east.

Sunken Wreck in Halifax Harbor.

A coal laden schooner with masts and rigging attached, lies on the bottom of the harbor, S. 40 deg. E. from Field's Rock, Shoal, near Point Pleasant, and about 200 yards westerly from the alignment of the Range Lights, namely, George's Island Light or with Fortmouth Light, N. 1 deg. E., in 15 fathoms water.
Lat. N. 44 deg. 37 min. 28 sec.
Long. W. 65 deg. 31 min. 9 sec.
An iron can buoy, painted green, has been moored on the eastern or channel side of the vessel's stern and removed, or it is ascertained that they are not an obstruction to navigation, a boat, showing two white lights, at night about 12 feet apart vertically, will be kept moored to the green buoy.
Masters of vessels are cautioned to keep on the eastern or channel side of the green buoy.

WOMAN TRAVELS CAPE TO CAIRO

LONDON, April 17.—Miss Hary Hall, the first lady to accomplish the feat of crossing the whole length of the African continent from the Cape to Cairo, is now making a stay in Cairo to rest from the fatigue of her wonderful journey.
The most remarkable feature of the exploit is perhaps that Miss Hall, who, of course, is no novice at travelling, or even exploration, journeyed with no companion of her own sex. No less wonderful is the fact that throughout the thousands of miles of forest, plains, rivers and lakes traversed by the intrepid lady, she was never for long away from the haunts of civilization.
Her journey would bless, and Stanley would exclaim in wonder; for Miss Hall's travels emphasize the amazing change that has come over the face of Africa within the short space of fifteen or even ten years. It was marvellous enough when Gondokoro and the Upper Nile were brought within the sphere of tourist travel, but that sphere is now spreading to Uganda and the equatorial lakes, and eventually it will embrace all that lies between the seat of antiquity on the Mediterranean and the land of Good Hope.

DR. TROTTER MAY GO TO STATES

St. JOHN, N. B. April 17.—The committee appointed to procure a successor to Rev. Dr. Trotter, who has resigned as president of Acadia College, consists of Dr. B. H. Eaton, Dr. J. Cahoon, Dr. E. N. Saunders and himself. It is understood that at the present time the committee has not in view anyone to succeed Dr. Trotter, whose resignation will go into effect August 1, the commencement of the college year.
Considerable pressure was brought to bear in order to have Dr. Trotter reconsider his decision to resign. He was offered a year's rest with full salary, and with the privilege, if he felt so disposed, of resigning at the end of the year, but he felt that he was not equal to again assuming the responsibilities which his duties would involve.
It is learned that probably Dr. Trotter's services will eventually be lost to the maritime provinces. Already he is in possession of offers from theological colleges in the United States, and it is to one of these that it is believed he will remove. The salary mentioned is said to be in the neighborhood of \$4,000.
There is no credence whatever placed in the report that Dr. Trotter may assume the pastorate of Germain street Baptist church here.
