TORONTO, June 19—(CP)—Trading was light and prices steady but for minor weakness in the base metal shares today on the Toronto stock exchange.
Volume was the smallest for a full session in three weeks at 64,000 shares.
Selling was again in evidence in Wright-Hargreaves and the price drifted down 10 cents to a new low for the year at 4.65. Hallor also set a new low at \$4, off 50 cents for the day while losses of 3 to 5 cents were netted by Lamark, Malartic Gold Fields, Pioneer and Trook Hughes, Lake Shore weakened 1-2 to 15 1-2, Bralorne and East Malartic recorded gains.
Noranda weakened 1-8 to 51 7-8 and Waste-Amulet and Pead Oreille displayed mild weakness. Foothills firmed 5 cents to 45.
The shares of Morris-Kirkland Gold Mines, Limited, were delisted today because of the filing of a bankruptcy order against the company.

NEW YORK, June 19—(CP)—The Canadian dollar advanced 3-16 of a cent to a discount of 11 5-8 per cent against United States funds in today's dull foreign exchange dealings. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.09-9.99 per cent discount.)
The pound Sterling held unchanged at \$4.03 1-2 and the Mexican peso at 20.68 cents and the Shanghai dollar at 5.58 cents were a shade lower. Other leading currencies were unchanged.

NEW YORK, June 19—(AP)—Stocks rallied and slipped at intervals in today's market and, despite a little buying support in the final hour, closing trends were irregular.
Distillers Seagram, up 1-8 and Lake Shore off the same amount, were the only stocks to show changes among the Canadian issues.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged at 41.8 after having been off .2 of a point at noon. Except for several large blocks of low-priced stocks, dealings were relatively light throughout. Transfers totalled 469,590 shares compared with 476,240 yesterday.
Chrysler got up 1 1-8 points and General Motors 1-8 as opinions varied as to just how much of a curtailment in production would be necessary because of shortage of materials.
Commonwealth and Southern turned over in blocks of 1,000-5,000 shares, unchanged at 7-16. This company's senior stocks, though, was up 2 points at a new 1941 top, reflecting decision of the concern to abide by integration provisions of the holding company law and dispose of some of its northern properties. American Car and Foundry pd also touched a new high for the move.
At the finish modest improvement was shown for U.S. Steel, Lott, U.S. Rubber, United Aircraft, Montgomery Ward, Western Union, Kennecott, American Smelting, Johns-Manville and Du Pont.
