A DEMAND TO BE RESISTED.

There is a demand in certain quarters for increased duties on woollen goods. It is a demand that ought to be resisted. Our own view is that the existing customs tariff of Canada is much too high, so high as to constitute a serious burden and an impediment to progress in the Maritime Provinces.

The present demand of the woollen manufacturers of the west comes at a bad time. The great mass of consumers have for years past been buying at inflated values. The cost of living has greatly increased. On the other hand the purchasing power of the masses is less than it was a few years ago.

"On woollen goods imported from Germany the present duty reaches close to half the cost" says the Toronto Globe. The statement will not likely be challenged. If we are now paying half as much again as the cost of these woollens and yet with this measure of protection the Canadian manufacturers of woollens cannot live, they had better economize in their management, squeeze the water out of their so-called capital or change their business.

This is not a party question. The political parties have both surrendered to the manufacturers. It is a matter between the manufacturers and the consumers. The manufacturers may be relied upon to get any and every advantage they can by coaxing or threatening the Government. Too often they have had their way and concession after concession has been made them and so covered up in the complicated tariff schedules that the people do not know how much they have paid or are paying in this form of tribute.

Generally speaking, if the Maritime Provinces are to have a chance to live in the federation the tariff must be made lower and not higher. The Government should be encouraged and supported in its resistance to the manufacturers' demands, and especially at the present time. Our people are fairly awake to the facts of the case. He would be a bold politician who would approach the consuming class in the Maritime Provinces today with the proposal to raise the customs tariff.

LIQUOR LEGISLATION IN SASKATCHEWAN.

As is well known, Manitoba has a local liquor law under which a majority of the electors may by their votes delegalise the sale of liquor

in their city or county. The Legislature of Saskatchewan at its recent session enacted a similar measure, preparatory to the creation of a municipal system to be adopted at a fall session after the general election now on. A local option campaign will follow the session of the Legislature.

Liquor licenses will be issued in Ontario and Manitoba, in districts where licenses are not forbidden by local option by laws. The new law provides further restrictions than those heretofore in vogue as to the hours of sale by licensed liquor sellers. All places for sale of liquor must close at ten o'clock p. m. and on Saturdays at seven p. m. remaining closed till seven on Monday morning. Sale of liquor in clubs is prohibited and all places of sale must be kept closed on Christmas, Good Friday, Thanksgiving and election days.

It will be noted that the prohibition in regard to clubs is in advance of our legislation in Prince Edward Island in that regard. There is a further clause which forbids under heavy penalty the common practice of cashing in a bar of the wage cheque of a laboring man. When it is remembered that the new Province contains a large population recently arrived from Europe where temperance sentiment is much less advanced than in Canada, it will be seen that the liquor legislation of Saskatchewan is quite as advanced as could be reasonably be expected.

A REFORMATORY NEEDED.

A lad of thirteen arrested on charge of theft, called forth from His Honor the Stipendiary Magistrate renewed comment on the need of a reformatory for juvenile criminals and delinquents. The want has long been felt, and it is a serious one. Until it is supplied the Magistrate has no alternative but to send convicted offenders, of whatever age to jail. The difficulty in the way of creating a reformatory here is our limited population. The number of inmates for such an institution if once established would be few, and the expense of maintaining a properly equipped institution would be considerable. Probably the best practicable solution would be to secure access to the reformatories at St. John or Halifax, but before this can be done legislation must be had to legalise the sending of delinquents out of the Province and also terms must be agreed upon with the authorities in a sister Province. The matter is, however, too important to be allowed to remain in its present unsatisfactory state.

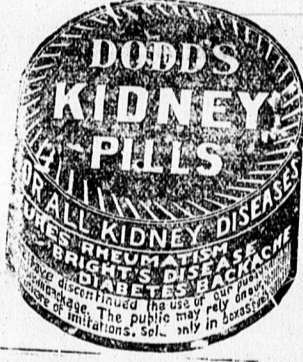
Premier McBride of British Columbia has given out that he will not be a candidate for the federal Parliament as had been reported, but that he may make an eastern tour before the election in the Conservative interest.

And now the Sultan of Turkey, finding his empire seething with the spirit of revolt proposes to set up a Parliament. Of course it must come in time, but the period of transition from despotism to a representative system is likely to be stormy in Turkey, as it has been in Russia and Persia.

An airship, supporting itself wholly by its motive power without the aid of gas support, made a circuit of fifteen miles in 42 minutes and returned to the exact place of starting. This was done at Baltimore. No one doubts now that the air-ship has come to stay. The flight of fifteen miles will soon be extended to hundreds of miles. But we fear there may be many fatal wrecks in windy weather.

The preponderance of Conservative votes at the June election in Ontario was quite remarkable, there being 277,914 Conservative to 182,230 Liberal votes polled. The Winnipeg Free Press, Liberal, points out that it was quite different in Manitoba, where, though the Roblin Government obtained the large majority of 29 to 12 in the House, the popular vote at the polls was very evenly divided. For the Roblin Government's candidates, 31,067 votes were cast, against them 30,365 votes were cast.

We hear with regret of drunkenness and disorder in Souris and that the prosecutor for the district is not doing his duty. Here in Charlottetown we know something of what an earnest and capable prosecutor can do. The temperance people of King's should make a strong effort to hold up the prosecutors to energetic action and failing that should demand their dismissal. This applies to the western as well as the eastern section of the Island. The temperance forces are strong enough if they act untidely and with determination in these matters to have their wishes attended to.
