Silver Fox Farming

H. J. Kennedy returned recently from a meeting of representatives of Purina Fox Chow brought together by the Canadian management.

A meeting of the Directors of the Silver Fox Exhibitors' Association of Prince Edward Island, will be held in Charlottetown Wednesday afternoon, February 27th.

President L. J. O'Reilly of the American National Fox and Fur Breeders' Association recently advised members that steps were being taken to put a stop to the smuggling of Silver Fox pelts from Canada.

Charles M. Daniels who will be remembered as a big figure at American Fox shows some twelve years or more ago, is still conducting his fox ranch in the Adirondacks and making a success of it.

Silver Foxes, descendants of two pairs purchased on Prince Edward Island some seventeen years ago, are still being raised on the summer estate of J. Pierpont Morgan.

Karakul sheep farming is attracting the attention of ranchers in sections of Idaho. There are several small flocks in the vicinity of Twin Falls.
