The suspension of compulsory savings means the Dominion will lose a source of money which yielded about \$10,000,000 a year, following establishment of the plan in 1942.

The suspension of the savings plan is effective on July 1.

In all, about \$200,000,000 will have been yielded for the use of the government during the operation of the plan. This sum will be repaid after the war.

In other taxation revisions, the Minister announced that in-laws will be taxed as dependent relatives for income tax purposes.

The tax allowances for children will cover all children dependent on the taxpayer including legitimate children.

Under revisions of the corporation and excess profits taxes, losses in any year may be carried back one year or forward three years for tax purposes.

Business concerns will be granted double depreciation on new capital investment after a certain date.

Provision also is made for rapid depreciation on new assets for tax purposes.

Business firms may borrow on the security of the refundable portions of the excess profits and corporation tax.

Compulsory savings continue in the corporation and excess profits tax fields.

One half of the expenditure for maintenance and repairs in a period of one year will be allowed against income of previous fiscal periods in computing corporation and excess profits taxes.

The time for presenting appeals from income tax assessments in the case of members of the armed forces has been extended from 30 days to one year.

The tariff changes cover a total of 87 items—20 of them putting agricultural implements and machinery under the free list.

Items have been established and the other 67 items are amended to remove anomalies and to facilitate administration.

The three new items include one putting all kinds of breads, biscuits on the free list, another allowing duty-free entrance of articles used in the manufacture of explosives and transportation of blood plasma and a third item covering certain chemical and other machinery.

Minor changes in the income tax laws were made with a view to simplifying the law.

Meeting cases of special hardship in supporting a dependent child in a self-contained domestic establishment is allowed an additional tax credit of \$108 which puts him in the same position as if he had a wife.
