KAISER IS AFTER BRITISH SECRETS

LONDON, October 28.—Kaiser William's action is determined upon the appointment of Prince Ernest Hohenzollern to the post of German ambassador in London, in the place of Count Mat. erlich, while not an altogether new departure, is nevertheless a somewhat sensational one. For Princess Ernest Hohenzollern is not only a niece of King Edward, but likewise a full-blooded member of the royal house of England and a princess of Great Britain and Ireland, being a younger daughter of Queen Victoria's second and sailor son, the late Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh and Coburg. As such, the future German ambassador in London will outrank every other woman of the diplomatic corps and enjoy an altogether unique position at the court of St. James.

The Kaiser has been prompted to make this move by the advantages derived by the Austrian ambassador in London, Count Albert Mensdorff, from his kinship with King Edward and the royal family. Both the monarch and the reigning house of England treat the count well and, thanks to this, Austrian interests receive altogether special consideration in England on the part of the court and the government. King Edward takes such an active part in the management of the foreign affairs of the nation, as he is entitled to do by the terms of the constitution, that the possibility of approaching him at all times to discuss pending issues, in the role of a member of his family rather than as a foreign diplomat, is of great advantage to Austria.

THE CANADIAN MILITIA PRAISED

LONDON, Oct. 27.—Colonel Stone formerly commanding the Canadian Artillery at the Royal Service Institution recently delivered a lecture on the organization of the Canadian militia. In the course of the lecture he said the system of training inaugurated by General Hutcheon both for cavalry and infantry, was a daring innovation, the success of which, however more than justified it. It amounted in principle to the application of common sense and adaptation of the means available to the end in view. As regards the infantry, our militia has nothing to gain by borrowing anything from Canada. The constitution of the two forces were very similar but our system of instructions and training was more advanced, and occupies a far longer time than it does in Canada.

Concluding, Colonel Stone said no one can be associated with the Canadian militia as he has been without being deeply impressed with the intensely national character of the force. The militia enters into the daily life of the Canadian citizen and farmer. Colonel Stone counts it as a special honor that his name is still retained on the Canadian militia list as an "unattached" officer as he thought his official connection with Canada was severed some years ago. He says he learned many things in Canada, and not the least was the true significance of the word "patriotism".

THE WAR OFFICE WANTS HORSES

CALGARY, Oct. 26.—Colonel Lessard, acting for the British war office, is consulting the ranchers here in regard to the adoption of a registration system, such as obtains in Great Britain, under which horse owners agree, in return for the annual payment of ten shillings per head, to hold a specified number of horses at the disposal of the government, to be delivered in case of emergency. The price to be offered the ranchers in Alberta is understood, to be \$150 per head.

WESTERN BEEF TRUST FEARED

WINNIPEG, Oct. 23.—The first session of the beef trust investigation will be held at Calgary on November 1st, and cattle-men of the three provinces are providing evidence which they claim will show the industry is in the hands of an iron clad trust, whereby the domestic trade is parcelled out to certain interests and the export business to others, rendering it impossible for the farmers or small ranchers to secure adequate profit. They claim that competition is destroyed, not so much by the refusal of cars by railroads in the export business as by the manipulation of ocean space, which is turned over by shipping agents to one concern for disposition. Sessions will be held in all parts of the west and ultimately in Ontario and Great Britain.
