IN MEMORIAM

CAPT. ED. DICKS. Captain Edward J. Dicks, widely known mariner of Prince Edward Island, died in Sydney, N.S., Monday, Jan. 26, 1943, at the age of 62 years.

Coming from a sea-faring family, he spent about half a century on the water. He was a member of the most every eastern Canadian port. Most of his life he commanded his own sailing schooners engaged in the fishery.

Born in Newfoundland, the late Capt. Dicks came here when he was very young and made his home in this province until about eight years ago when he moved to Sydney. He did not sever his connection with the sea after leaving there.

The deceased owned and operated Dalry, popular tourist hotel on the North Shore of this province, for several years. After this he resided for a time on the Malpeque Road where he had a business. He also lived for a time at Georgetown.

A son, Bill, is at present a prisoner of war in Germany. He is a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force and was captured about two years ago.

His daughters survive. They are: Edith, Mrs. Neil Durant, St. Summerside; Edna, Mrs. Victor Chalmers, Summerside; Audrey, Mrs. Harry Phillips, Charlottetown; and Catherine, Mrs. Clifford McGaughan, Charlottetown.

He is also survived by his second wife, the former Frances McCabe, who died in Charlottetown. His first wife, Alice MacDonald of Georgetown, predeceased him by a number of years.

The funeral will be held in Sydney where the interment will take place.

Confident Red Cross Objective Will Be Reached

Dr. W.J.P. MacMillan, who has just returned from Toronto, where he attended an Executive meeting of the National Red Cross Society, states that there is confidence in the Red Cross organization that the National objective of \$10,000,000 will be reached.

Dr. MacMillan stated that the actual need of the Red Cross for 1943 is in reality \$11,750,000. The budget alone is for \$10,800,000. He further stated that the common belief in the war industry circles was that there will be a general invasion of the Continent before many months, and if this takes place the calls on the Red Cross will be beyond all imagination and comprehension.

(Continued from page 1) defeat of the price ceiling, with inflation again under way; the second, an administrative task of such magnitude that it is, in his opinion, quite unmanageable, even if public opinion would support such a wide-spread extension of the subsidy principle.

Mr. Gordon said he believes there is an under-current of belief in the farming community that farmers constitute the one group which could benefit from inflation.

It had been argued that under inflation agricultural prices would rise faster than the prices of goods or supplies required for farm consumption.

"No one can say positively whether this would happen or not and I fervently hope we never have the opportunity of finding out," Mr. Gordon said. "What we do know is that the last time the experiment was tried in 1918-20, everyone suffered eventually and farmers perhaps the most heavily of all."

Mr. Gordon said the administrative work of the Prices Board has grown so quickly and reached into so many fields that it gives officials cause for concern. They are engaged in a serious study. "How to spread some of it out and yet retain the integration and co-ordination which is so essential."
