**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**CHICAGO, Dec. 6 (AP)—** Rye futures prices, which moved sharply upward at the start of trading today, fell back after buying and short covering operations appeared to have been satisfied and Winnipeg rye encountered a setback.

**TORONTO, Dec. 6 (CP)—** Base Metal and Western Oil groups collected, small inland gains today and the solids finished slightly down for the day.

Heavy trading and higher prices marked the action in some of the solids but the group was off .07 at the close. Duquesne and Colomac were leaders. Colomac traded 130.00 shares and advanced 12 cents and Duquesne turned over 50,000 shares and gained 17 cents.

**WINNIPEG, Dec. 6 (CP)—** A firm opening rye futures declined sharply after mid-session today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange, closing 3 to 5 cents a bushel lower.

Export trade continued light with only one sale reported an order for 200,000 bushels of wheat for shipment to the United Kingdom.

**NEW YORK, Dec. 6 (AP)—** Demand for steels, motors, aviation, amusements and specialties today helped lift the Stock Market to a 15-year average peak although considerable profit taking accompanied the drive and extreme gains of 2 or more points were reduced in most cases at the close.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 2 of a point at 76.4, a high since April 14, 1931. The industrial average made a top since March 9, 1937.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 6 (CP)—** In lively transactions prices worked substantially higher today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. Industrials and papers touched a new eight-year high in the indices and have now achieved this every session this week. Utilities were at a new five year top in the averages for the third time since Monday. Individual increases ranged from fractions to more than four points.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 5 (CP)—** Planned as a haven for Polish refugees unable to find a home in Europe and to Polish Canadians unable to work because of ill-health or old age, a 384-acre farm outside Knowlton, Que., 60 miles east of Montreal, has been purchased by the Polish Canadian Welfare Society, it was announced today.

The farm, purchased from John Hayes Pflus for \$7,500 will be cleared by Government bulldozers in the early spring, and equipped with army buildings from the camp at Farnham which the Polish Society plans to purchase. It is expected to be ready by next summer as a self contained community with complete medical, religious and teaching facilities.

The Polish Canadian Welfare Society, headed by F. Wroblewski, plans to bring about 3,000 Polish refugees to Canada provided they can get Government sanction.

**OTTAWA, Dec. 5 (CP)—** Defence Headquarters announced last night that Brig. A. V. Tremaine, 58, a permanent force officer for 37 years, is going on leave pending retirement from the Canadian Army.

A native of Halifax, he was educated at Kings Collegiate Windsor N.S., and at the Royal Military College, Kingston, Ont., from which he graduated in 1908. He was wounded severely in the First Great War in which he served with the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery and the 1st Heavy Battery.

His appointments between wars included professor of artillery, R.C. Artillery instructor at Halifax and Kingston, and command of "A" Battery, R.C.H.A.

For the first two years of the recent war Brig Tremaine was officer administering the Royal Canadian Artillery and in command of No 1 Artillery Training Centre at Petawawa, Ont., and supervised the training of thousands of artillery reinforcements. Since November 1944, he has been chairman of the Officers Survey and Classification Board at Ottawa.
