EUROPEAN CORN BORER.—Warnings are being posted throughout Canada of the presence in the United States of the European Corn Borer. There is grave danger of the pest being brought to Canada. This pest attacks corn, potatoes, oats, fodder and garden crops, and is doing great damage where found in the United States. It is recognized by holes in the stalk of the above mentioned plants with sawdust-like material issuing from them, indicating the presence of the borer or caterpillars. In the case of corn, broken tassels also show where the borer is at work. If the infested stems are split open the caterpillar will be found at work. The insect spends the winter as a caterpillar in old stalks of corn or other food plants and changes to a reddish brown pupa late in the spring. The pupa soon turns into a moth. Persons are asked to keep a constant lookout for this most dangerous pest and to report immediately all suspicious cases.
