Sir—In the Patriot of the 15th inst a Lady Housekeeper complains about the present practice of wholesale buying of poultry in the Market House and she has the audacity to assume that the Market House was built by the town people for themselves and their country friends. If she would only take the trouble to look up the amount of revenue that has been derived from the market stalls, taken from the country people during the last thirty five years, she would be nearer the mark if she would say that the country folk has built the market for themselves and their town friends. The majority of the wholesale buyers in the Market are the butchers who have to pay high rent for their stalls, and so have a right to encourage trade, both in their own interests, and that of the country. If the country people had to depend on Housekeeper for the selling of their poultry, the supply would likely far exceed the demand, consequently Housekeeper would be in a position to have things all her own way in the matter of
