Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made only in certain cases. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, or certain conditions. An exhausted homesteader may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$3.00. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

HON. J. A. MCNEILL REVIEWS HIS WORK

do, but I assure you that from long experience a workman who does not receive a satisfactory wage gives most inferior work. True economy does not consist in obtaining labor at the lowest possible price, so that instead of giving whole hearted service, the laborer is filled with dissatisfaction, with no interest or pride in his work and only grudgingly putting in his time. We have endeavored to secure the very best possible service, and to improve our roads as far as possible to the utmost limit there is a member in this House who thinks that too much money is spent on its roads, the sum of \$6,140,273.13 and practically all borrowed money and other Provinces are spending similar large amounts on their roads and not charging it against the revenue. Under the present Act, no district under a capable Road Master can have its roads neglected and I believe that the road tax collected is sufficient in many districts to look after the maintenance of its roads after they have been brought up to a normal standard and to provide also a gradual improvement. Many districts, however, will need much assistance before they reach this standard but it only needs a few more years of careful and judicious expenditure to bring nearly all the districts will be self supporting.

I would strongly urge on our friends of the Opposition to have a little more faith and courage to approve the expenditure necessary for this purpose for I believe that good roads are the greatest factor in the improvement of our country conditions.

The transportation question has always been a burning one in this Province and communication with the mainland has overshadowed the importance of local traffic. The communication problem is now happily being solved and our attention must henceforth be given to the improvement of our roads. These are the primary channels of all traffic and are the origin of every form of industry and commerce. But for the common roads, our railways would decay in idleness and our ocean liners would rust at their wharves. Countries have progressed without railways but roads are vital to progress and development. The average cost of hauling one ton a mile over our country roads is estimated at 25c. and sometimes is twice that amount. When we consider that the P. E. I. Railway hauls annually 120,000 tons and it is estimated that three times that amount never reaches it and that the average haul is a distance of five miles, you can estimate what the saving would be if the road haul could be reduced to 15c. (On paying road tax cost is only 8c.) A saving of 10c. per ton on 500,000 tons on a five mile haul amounts to \$250,000 per annum.

We do not realize the tremendous cost of transportation over unimproved roads. A few bad hills or a few swampy places on a road reduce the size of every load and increase the total cost of carriage almost beyond belief. And it is well within the mark to say that \$250,000 yearly could be saved to the people of this Province by bringing all the roads up to the standard of the best. Can anyone say that it would not be economical to invest money freely and if necessary in excess of our revenue to reduce this annual expense and leave this large amount in the pocket of our people especially when there is the added benefit of improved facility of intercourse, the possibility of more intensive farming, the removing of the isolation of farm life and bringing to it some of the advantages and attractions of the towns. I claim that every dollar judiciously spent on the improvement of our roads and every dollar similar spent on the improvements of our schools meets with the approval of all our well thinking people and is the best interest of the Province.

Now Mr. Chairman, I would like to say a few words regarding the cost of the present road system in comparison with the preceding one. Our Opposition friends make the claim the cost of collecting and expending the road tax was much more economical under the old Act than under
