THE RAILWAY CLAIMS. Claim Number Three in the memorial is in respect of the P. E. Island Railway, on which the Province had expended \$3,144,000, before the road was transferred to Canada.

CLAIM NUMBER FIVE. is based on the increased subsidies granted to the larger Provinces to meet the increased cost of Education, Public Works, Asylums, Agriculture, Charities, etc.

CLAIM NUMBER SIX. in brief is that this Province is entitled to payment of subsidies and representation in Parliament on the basis of an assumed population of 180,000.
