

# WOMAN SUFFRAGE IN PORTUGAL

LISBON, Dec. 17 (Special)—The decision of the Lower House of Parliament in Portugal on the Woman Suffrage question is expected shortly. A few months since the Senate, in debating the Bill to reform the electoral-law amended the first clause by the addition of the following paragraph: "Women having attained the age of twenty-five years and having passed through a secondary or special course of education shall be eligible for the municipal and Parliamentary franchise." This amendment was only carried after a long and lively discussion, during which some speakers vehemently advocated it as realizing the aim of justice and others combated it with the ancient arguments so dear to anti-feminists.

# UNIONISTS ARE REVEALING THEMSELVES

## CARELESSNESS AND GUN POWDER

PARIS, Dec. 17 (Special)—The "Matin" publishes an article drawing attention to what it describes as the scandalous carelessness of the Gunpowder Factory Department of the Ministry of War.

Since the disaster to the "Liberte" no reform, according to the "Matin," has been carried out in the powder factories, which, though they supply the Navy with ammunition, are under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of War. The Navy, however, besides improving the conditions in which its ammunition is stored on board, has succeeded in obtaining powder strengthened by diphenylamine, such as that provided to the Army. Moreover, naval officers have been empowered to supervise the manufacture of the ammunition, and are absolute judges as to whether it shall be accepted or rejected by the Service.

The "Matin" publishes the report of the Admiralty on 517 tons of ammunition manufactured on June 2, 1912, and worth nearly \$1,000,000. Parts of the gun-cotton contained greyish and yellowish lumps, and others fragments of mouldy sacks and numerous small splinters of wood, while two lots were coarser than they should have been.

## To Great Disadvantage. If Allowed They Would Tear Down The Parliament of England

DUBLIN, Dec. 17 (Special)—J. Redmond, M. P., speaking at Cork, said that within the last few weeks both inside and outside Parliament, Unionist bodies had revealed themselves and their policy to the people of the country in such a way as to ensure their speedy condemnation. In Parliament the leaders of the Unionist party proved themselves Parliamentary anarchists. Their policy was that if they, the minority—with a large majority of over 100 against them—were not allowed to have their own way they would pull down and destroy the Parliament of England. Outside Parliament they had been proving themselves to be reactionaries of the worst type. A deliberate attempt, he remarked, had been made for the first time in history by the responsible leaders of one of the great political parties of this country to enable the minority by violence and disorder to put argument and reason absolutely on one side, and by violence and disorder to overcome the vast majority of the elected representatives of the people of Great Britain and Ireland. He wished to say in all seriousness that if that attempt succeeded, if it was once established, that by the sheer disorder and violence of an organized body of men in Parliament the majority of the elected representatives of the people could not be overborne, it would mean an end of Parliamentary government.
