USED HANKIE YIELDS HORDE OF BACTERIA

LONDON, Aug. 18 - (CP) - A used handkerchief, although dry, can distribute a dangerous number of bacteria if waved in the air, reports the Harvard Hospital Research Unit at Salisbury, which has been investigating the common cold.

An article in The Lancet said that in tests volunteers used a special handkerchief for two days. It was dried and then shaken. Researchers estimated that in half a minute's shaking by hand, 15,000 bacteria-carrying particles were released.

Not all were dangerous but tests with "the best available serial disinfectants" showed that the particles, while airborne, were almost completely resistant to such methods of attack.
