BABY STARVING HE TRIES TO STEAL

NEW YORK, June 21 (Special)—A pale little woman with a baby in her arms sat for hours in Court of General Sessions, where Judge Foster was imposing sentences and listening to pleas. She paid no attention to the proceedings but kept her eyes fixed on the "pen" where the prisoners awaiting arraignment are kept. The clerk called the case of Joseph Whitman, a tinsmith, charged with robbery. Albin Lasso, who has testified that Whitman had snatched \$50 from his hands as he was entering his home at No. 200 West Thirty-third street last Sunday, was in court to press the charge. It was unnecessary, for Whitman pleaded guilty.

Probation officers reported that there was no record against the prisoner and that he had been working steadily up to two months ago. As is customary, Judge Foster asked if there was anyone in the court room who could offer any information regarding the prisoner. The little woman carrying the baby took the witness stand and said that she was the prisoner's wife.

She said that they had come from Buffalo two years ago and that until April of this year her husband had been employed as a tinsmith. Eight weeks ago her husband lost his position and on the same day their daughter Edith was born. They had been able to save no money owing to illness and they were in want almost from the day that her husband lost employment.

They had had nothing to eat for a day when her husband went out on the day of the robbery. Whitman, she said, saw the complainant going up into his house counting a roll of bills and he grasped them, dropping half of them as he ran. Mrs. Whitman said that for three days she was unaware of what had happened to her husband and afraid to go away for fear that some one would come with notice of his death in her absence. She thought he might have committed suicide.

Finally she went to the door and "borrowed" ten cents from a woman who passed so that she could get condensed milk for the baby. It had lived on bread crumbs soaked in water for three days. Judge Foster said that he would try to obtain work for Whitman, and in that case would suspend sentence. He gave Mrs. Whitman money and sent her with a probation officer to friends she has found at No. 446 West Twenty-fifth street.
