MOUNT ALLISON MOCK PARLIAMENT IN LIVELY SESSION.

The proceedings were enlivened by the appearance of about twenty suffragettes, who, carrying banners on which was inscribed "Votes for Women," paraded through the hall making a demonstration. The leader made a speech which caused much amusement.

LECTURE AT LONG RIVER.

A crowded hall greeted Mr. Justice Fitzgerald at Long River last Thursday evening and listened with deep interest for upwards of two hours to an inspiring address on "The New Outlook." The Judge was present by request of New London North Farmers' Institute, under whose auspices the lecture was delivered. The Vice-President, Bradford Millman, presided and after expressing regrets at the absence of President John S. Cousins, who was attending a funeral in Summerside, referred to the good fortune of the Institute in having as speaker Mr. Justice Fitzgerald whom he then asked to address the meeting. The Judge said he was glad to show his interest in agriculture by giving an address before such an audience. He spoke in optimistic terms of the bright outlook for the many Farmers' Institutes and farmers of this Province and alluded to the grand opportunities for mutual help and co-operation afforded by such.

He then gave a very practical talk on various lines of agriculture, such as potato growing, seed grain, sugar mangels, improvement of live stock, etc. The Judge passed around for inspection some excellent specimens of a white potato-"Virginia Gold Corn"-which he highly recommended as a good cropper and seeder, and a prize-getter when in competition with other varieties. He dealt with scab and said it was not a disease but was caused by an irritant in the soil such as ashes. He quoted the disinterested opinion of experts as to the special adaptability of this Province for growing seed grain-especially the "Bismarck" oats-and emphasized the difference between feed oats and seed oats. The Judge thought more attention should be given to the growing of mangels or sugar beets and recommended the Foreign Sugar beet as containing a high percentage of sugar and a good yielder. His remarks upon the improvement of live stock, especially horses and cattle, were in the light of comparison with what has been done in Europe and British Isles. Farmers of this Province would do well to avoid the mixing of breeds. Space forbids a reference to all the

(Continued from page 2) understanding arrived at between the two churches. As one who is on the ground, I don't know what arm-chair critics are talking about when they say that co-operation in Home Mission work is not practicable.

During its first years of work in Alberta the co-operating committees have dealt with 170 places in which services have been changed to a degree required by the local situation. In addition to this such vast territories as the Peace River country, the districts tributary to the C. N. R. and C. P. R. from Edmonton west, the ranges west of the C. and S. line to the mountains, the immense territory south and east of Castor, also territory tributary to Medicine Hat, have all been placed upon a definite basis for new work between the two churches. This immense territory will easily include territories as many places as those already specified which will bring the total number of places affected up to at least six hundred.

From all this work, there have come five protests to the Provincial Committee. In nearly every case these protests were due to inaccurate information supplied to the Committee.

Of these protests, one was allowed, one rejected, one satisfactory settled, and two referred back to the local Committee.

This year a number of other places have brought or sent requests for readjustment, similar to that referred to in the opening of this statement. I have not taken these into account at all.

There may be other protests coming up this year; but I have not heard of any, and I believe five out of the nine local committees have met. There has, of course, been quite a difference of opinion at some of our meetings. Had it been otherwise it would be a sign that it was not a vital work.

The above is a statement, not of theories but of facts, as to what has been done in one year. If I could I would proclaim these words, as the expression of my best judgment, to every member and adherent of the Presbyterian Church in Canada; for the solution of the Home Mission

problem in Western Canada, organic union is not a necessity.

Leave us alone in Alberta and ere long over-lapping in Home Mission work will be at the vanishing point; and, with a definite policy for men as there is now for money, every field will be supplied, as it is my opinion that there are enough willing and competent men to man our fields if the church will adopt a definite recruiting policy, both here and in the old country.

This work is not dividing the church, nor is it launching us into endless trouble, re church property, etc., as Organic Union will inevitably do. It is, on the contrary providing a demonstration of true Christian unity, and it can be applied by all who will.

(Continued from page 2) placed under infant management. Get experts to work.

There are large companies operating branch works in many parts of the Dominion. Why not cater for some of those branches here? Foreign preserving houses buy large quantities of our fruits and garden products for canning and preserves. Advise these to give to their trade our products, in their exquisite native richness, fresh from the field, in preference to the soured stuff muddled and mutilated by hundreds of miles of freight carriage, and flavor killed by age.

Why export our wool, hides and skins, to other parts of Canada to be manufactured, and then re-imported in the form of finished leathers, boots, shoes, cloths and clothing, we paying the freights both ways and adding the higher priced labor of outside Provinces to convert them into usable articles?

This is a matter in which there must be an initiative. Our City Council or our Local Government are parties to deal with it. Their emphatic joint action might produce good results. Non-resident investors, who would reject private suggestion, might act upon authorized invitation. Give them tax exemption if they want it. But if you make it clear to them as a profitable business enterprise the trifling item of taxes will be the least of the inducements we have to offer.
