R. E. M'Ken & Co. purchased over 200 hogs yesterday and the front of their establishment was completely lined with pork. The highest price paid was 57 cents, a slight rise from previous market.

Frank Halliday and Thomas McLean Eldon, on Monday last crossed on the ice from Eldon to China Point across Pownal Bay with teams and loads for the city. This is the earliest crossing for years and the first for this season.

The Boston Post of recent date contains a large engraving of Percy W. Carver, formerly of Pownal, counsel for Herbert B. Newton of Brookline, Mass. who has sued Mrs. Chadwick of Cleveland to recover \$10,000. Mr. Carver has acquired considerable fame through this widely known case.

The Guardian learns that Harry C. Connolly, Grandon street, has been appointed assistant purser on the Government steamer Minto, vice John R. Davies. It is also understood that a number of the deck hands of the same steamer who had from P. E. I. have been replaced by men from Pictou.

An urgent message was sent to Ottawa yesterday asking that the Stanley call here to-day on her way to Summerside, bringing mails and passengers. If this is not done there will be no foreign mail till to-morrow. No word was received last night as to whether the Stanley would be sent here to-day.

Mr. Longard is manager of the chicken fattening station at Eldon and reports the station is doing a rushing business this fall and paying well. This business is fast becoming one of the leading industries in that section, many farmers taking it up.
