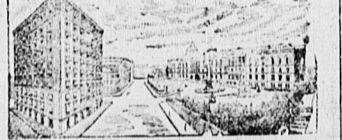

### CLERGYMAN HURT IN A FIGHT.

SACKVILLE, N. B., Sept. 6--As the culmination of a church quarrel extending over nearly a year, a clergyman who came to this country from Great Britain to take charge of the parish of Westmorland in the interest of the Anglican Church, was injured in a fight on Friday by one of his church warden, in the post office at Mount Whatley, about six miles from Sackville.

The clergyman is said to have had one of his fingers broken or dislocated and one eye blackened. Bishop Richardson, of Fredericton, has been informed of the affair, and is expected to investigate the matter in the course of a few days. The story as it reaches the St. John Telegraph correspondent, is as follows:

It seems that trouble arose in the parish soon after the arrival of the clergyman. The parish was divided in its sympathies, and about half the members and adherents withdrew their support and refrained from attending the services. One of the chief bones of contention was in connection with the purchase of a horse by the clergyman from a horseman, a member or adherent of the Church of England in Baie Verte. The animal, according to the clergyman, turned out to be blind of an eye, and consequently he objected most strenuously to paying the full price agreed upon. The seller was equally determined and at length went so far as to apease the clerical gentleman. Things went from bad to worse, and eventually Bishop Richardson was asked to come and straighten things out. Charges in writing were preferred against the rector, and a court of investigation was held, the result being the vindication of the accused so far as the church was concerned.

But the failure of the insurgents to prove their charges did not end the difficulties of the minister. Various attempts have been made to rid the parish of his services and it is understood that he was willing to go provided that the bishop would secure another parish for his occupation. The culmination of the wretched affair came last Friday, when the minister went to Mount Whatley post office for his mail. Accounts differ as to what happened after that, but there was some sort of a struggle in which it is said a fork handle was used, and in the course of a row the clergyman is said to have had one of his fingers dislocated or broken, and to have received a black eye.

It is understood that the facts have been communicated to Bishop Richardson and that there will be another investigation.

The clergyman occupied the pulpit Sunday as usual and preached to the usual sized congregation.

As to the merits of the church quarrel, there are varying opinions, but the fight, or assault, or whatever it was at Mount Whatley has caused an immense amount of talk and it is supposed that some decisive action will follow.

### A COLLISION IN BOSTON.

BOSTON, Sept. 7.--In the wake of heavy rains, a dense fog rolled in over the harbor and city today, and most of the local shipping and causing a collision in the harbor between the steamer Governor Cobb, from St. John and the steamer City of Gloucester, bound for Gloucester.

### TWO DROWNED FROM LAUNCH.

BROCKVILLE, Sept. 7.--J. J. Toole, detective, and A. Brandler, typewriter agent, were drowned from a launch five miles East of here last night. With their wives and J. D. Glendinning in charge of the boat the party left in a launch for Ogdensburg but the launch capsized. Glendinning managed to save the women and himself.

### BOSTON BALLOONIST FATALLY INJURED.

KEENE, N. H., Sept. 6--With hundreds of people looking on, Emiel Fred Hess, a Boston balloonist who has performed under the name of Prof. Miller, was probably fatally injured yesterday when his second parachute failed to open in time and he plunged to earth. The parachute opened only 25 feet from the ground and Hess' drop was practically unrelieved.

Hess was making a double parachute drop from a balloon before a holiday gathering of local Eagles, numbering nearly 3,000. Because of low hanging clouds he went up only about 450 feet before he made his first jump. This had carried him about 150 feet when he tried to unloose the fastenings of the second parachute. He was unsuccessful until nearly 100 feet from the ground. He dropped as soon as he freed it, but the parachute failed to open and his fall was sheer until the parachute opened 25 feet from the ground, too late to break the force of his fall. He landed in a corn field near the exhibition park. At the hospital where Hess was taken the doctors declared that he had practically no chance to live. He sustained a broken spine, five or six fractured ribs, and internal injuries. Hess was thirty years old and has a wife and several children living on Paul Street.

### BACK FROM INSPECTION.

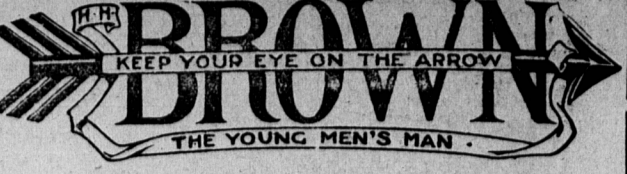

### INSTITUTION FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB.

HALIFAX, N. S. The school will reopen after the summer holidays on Monday, September 19th, when it is hoped all pupils will arrive promptly. At this school all pupils are taught to speak and to understand speech by reading the movements of the lips. There are throughout the Maritime Provinces many children, not actually deaf and dumb, but deaf enough to prevent their taking advantage of the ordinary public school instruction. Such children are eligible for admission to this school and should be sent, as their speech would be greatly improved as well as their power of lip-reading. Parents are only called upon to pay travelling expenses and furnish clothing the institution providing board, education, etc. Pupils may be admitted between the ages of six and eighteen years. Doctors, teachers and clergymen are earnestly requested to communicate with Principal Reason if they know of any deaf or partially deaf children in their neighbourhood.
