Survey Of Oil, Gold Resources Of Canada

OTTAWA, June 6--(CP)--In view of their importance in Canada and the country's potential petroleum resources and the particular attention of government survey parties this year.

The Mines and Geology Branch of the Department of the Interior has announced tonight a force of 170 men, making up of geological and topographical survey and exploratory parties, will leave Ottawa soon to map and investigate areas in the Yukon and the Northwest Territories.

The work of the Branch this year has been directed largely toward extension of the gold mining industry which provides foreign credits so essential to a country at war. It also is particularly interested in petroleum resources because of the increased domestic needs since the start of the war and the necessity of depending on foreign sources of supply.

Investigations also will be made of various minerals such as chromium, manganese, molybdenum and tungsten. Most of these are of particular importance in the production of armaments and munitions.

A total of 6 parties will be engaged in geological surveys and investigations and 11 in topographical mapping. In addition, two topographical parties will be employed on supervisory work.

The topographical mapping program for 1918 will be devoted entirely to surveys in the foothills district of Alberta, which now is of such importance as a potential source of petroleum supplies.

Of the geological parties, three will be in British Columbia, one in Saskatchewan, two in Manitoba, one in Ontario, four in Quebec, one in New Brunswick, one in Nova Scotia, one in Yukon and three in the Northwest Territories. Another party will be engaged in investigation of deposits of war minerals in British Columbia, another in the Yukon and the other in the rest of Canada.

The Central Guardian Royal Military College Takes On Positive Meaning

KINGSTON, June 6--(CP)--The Royal Military College of Canada, which has been playing an important role in providing efficient officers for the services, has been stripped of some of its traditional color but the dominant tradition of service takes on a more positive meaning.

When the cadets enrolled now step into their posts of duty in the armed forces the bright uniforms of peacetime will disappear from the campus. In peacetime many of the young men passed out of the college into civilian life, but now, with the nation at war, they will go into the armed forces.

The graduates all are expected to accept commissions in the navy or army or enter the air force if opportunity is available, and not to accept combatant commissions in the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve of the non-permanent active militia.

A gentleman cadet of the R. M. C. was a marked man in peacetime. The trim blue uniform with the bright red tunic for waiting out, and ceremonial cape and the small round "pill-box" formed a distinctive garb. When the next class enters the college in September, however, they will don khaki uniforms.

From then until the end of the war the cadets will be dressed as army officers without rank badges, and within the college walls will wear the standard khaki battle dress.

Coupled with the disappearance of the colorful uniform, the R. M. C. has taken to wearing in common with artillery and much of the cavalry of the Canadian army.

The college's once-prized riding school has been converted into a workshop and mechanical department. Instead of learning to ride horses with dignity the cadets now learn to repair and service cars and trucks.

In the first great War more than 95 per cent of all the graduates who were fit for service were under arms, and 15 per cent of them were killed. In all, they obtained more than 600 decorations and mentions in dispatches.
