Some 80 Ships Affect-ed By Ship Bill; In-cludes Two German And 28 Italian Craft

WASHINGTON, May 15—(AP)—By vote of nearly three to one, the Senate approved the administration ship seizure bill, empowering the President to requisition alien vessels now idle in United States harbors and use them in the national defence or British-aid programs.

Queen's fund to Furnish tea canteens

MONTREAL, May 15—(CP)—Headquarters here of the Queen's Canadian Fund for Air Raid Victims announced tonight that contributions now total \$192,553, compared with last night's figures of \$183,376.

A cable from the Lord Mayor of London to officials said that some of the fund's contributions will be used to provide mobile tea canteens for service in the bombed areas of Great Britain.

The cable said that many of the 75 canteens already purchased by the Lord Mayor's Fund—to which the Queen's Fund permits all contributions—now are in service. It added several of the canteens now on order are to bear the inscription, "Presented By The Queen's Canadian Fund."
