Kobe Latest Target For Superforts

Conservative Victory In Third King's

Maj. J. A. MacDonald Elected By A Substantial Majority Over Liberal Opponent.

Is Returned With Overall Majority

TORONTO, June 4 — (CP) — Premier George Drew and his Government swept back into power in Ontario on a tide of Progressive Conservative votes which reduced the Opposition to possibly 25 members in the 90 seat Legislature.

The C. C. F., official Opposition in the last Legislature, and the Liberals, failed diamally. Where in the last Legislature they marshalled 49 votes, their combined total in the new Legislature shaped up as some 30 fewer.

The Premier and his complete Cabinet scored personal triumphs on the basis of civilian votes in this 22nd Ontario provincial election. But C. C. F. leader E. B. Jolliffe and Liberal leader Mitchell Hepburn followed their parties' fortunes. They lost to Progressive Conservative candidates.

The vote gave Premier Drew, who since election in August, 1943, had led a minority 38-member Government, the first clear majority for the Progressive Conservatives since the 1929 elections. It confirmed in office a party which has governed Ontario for 27 of the last 40 years.

Keefe Elected In Ward Five Civic Contest

Mr. George R. Keefe, wholesale druggist, was elected yesterday as City Councillor for Ward 5 over Mr. Picton R. McCormac, laundry proprietor, by a majority of 127 votes. The total vote was 246 for Keefe to 219 for McCormac. Ward 5 West Central showed 102 votes for McCormac, 123 for Keefe; Ward 5 East Central showed 31 for McCormac and 98 for Keefe; and Ward 5 East showed 43 for McCormac and 90 for Keefe. At six o'clock Mr. R. R. Bell, returning officer, declared Mr. Keefe officially elected.
