The farmers of Middleton are making a successful fight against the many noxious weeds that have come to their farms. Imported hay, and seeds from the upper provinces. Many turned out Tuesday afternoon notwithstanding the threatening weather to hear what Prof. Lockhead and Mr. Clark had to say of these hardy invaders that have come to stay as long as they will be to grabbed. Mr. Clark advocated a special rotation in cases where a weed was particularly tenacious. The life history of the weed should be considered, and an effective special rotation should be one that would neither allow the weed to produce seed nor yet develop enough leaf to breathe; thorough cultivation and smothering crops being some of the means at disposal in eradicating weeds. The weeds of the district were named and well discussed by the men in the meeting. Prof. Lockhead dealt particularly with the question of how the farmers might now obtain seed that they could rely upon as being pure; he discussed the seed Control Act and showed where it might be amended so as to make it of even greater value to the farmers. A weed meeting will be held at Alberton Friday July 13th and on Saturday the last week meeting of the series will be held at St. Cleonor's.

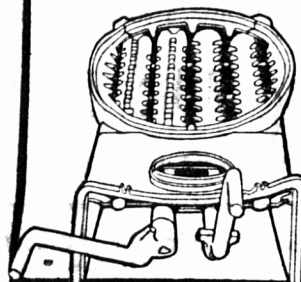

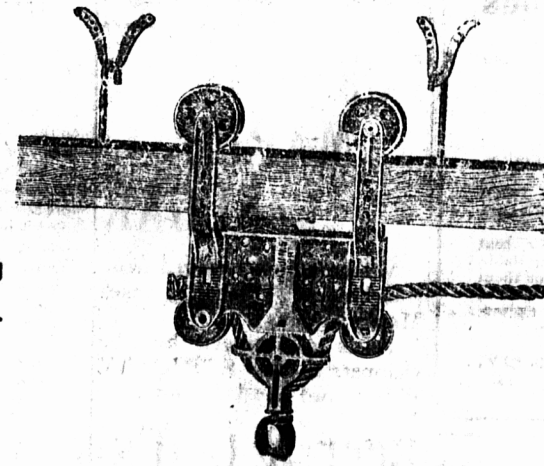
