Hunters Found But Guide Lost; May Be Dead

SUDBURY, Ont., Nov. 12—(CP)—Of five hunters and one guide reported missing within recent days in this section of Northern Ontario's hunting country, the hunters were safe tonight, but four play was suspected in the guide's 10-day-old disappearance.

A hundred men were combing the bush near Maple Point, Manitoulin Island, for Stanley Richards, 43, and since their four-day search had been so thorough police now doubted whether Richards was in the area in which he vanished.

Meantime, five hunters who had been lost emerged from the bush at various points outside Sudbury—none the worse for their hardships.

Jimmy Slack, 19, also known as James Pearson, walked into Watlain Colony, near Timmins, after two nights and three days astray and complained of nothing worse than cold feet.

L. R. MacNeil and his 14-year-old companion, Donald McFadden, were found after one of the most intensive searches ever conducted in the Matachewan locality.

The oldest of the missing men, 69-year-old William Griffiths of Gore Bay, turned up unharmed after a night in the open car here. Also safe after being missing overnight was Alfred St. Onge, 25, of nearby Chelmsford.
