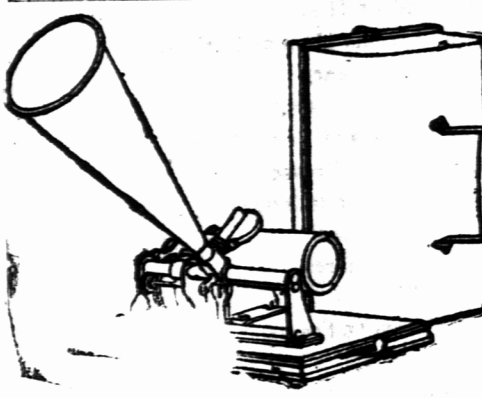

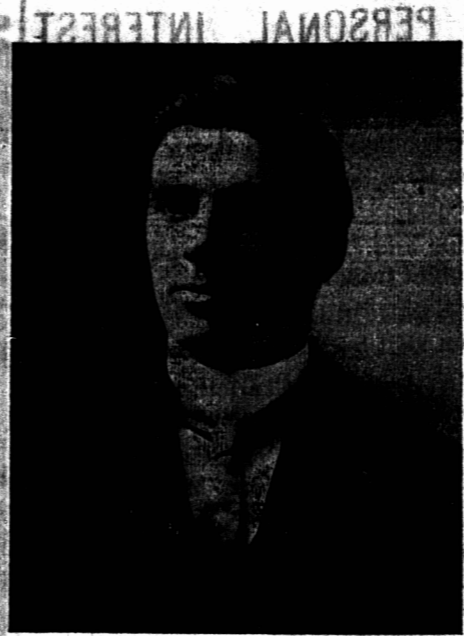

THE MARVELLOUS PROGRESS MADE

In Y. M. C. A. Work In the Last Year or Two

Largely Due to the Energy of the General Secretary, A. W. Robb. Great Development.

Prominent among the Institutions of this City, which stand for the moral uplift of its people, is the Young Men's Christian Association. In its aim to improve citizenship by contributing to the physical, mental and spiritual development of the young manhood of the community it deserves and should receive the hearty support of our citizens.

A visit to the Y. M. C. A. rooms at any time between early morning and 10 o'clock at night, will demonstrate to any one that much and incalculable good is being done. Who can estimate what a young man has been saved from by having such a place of resort as the Y. M. C. A. for his evening; after the work of the day has been concluded.

Many of our citizens are evidently but partially, if at all, acquainted with the work being done by the Y. M. C. A.

During the past few years the growth of the work has been phenomenal. From a membership of a little over a hundred it has grown to the comparatively large number of 446 which should be doubled in a town of the size of Charlottetown.

In the past after repeated attempts and failure it was found impossible to keep up the physical work. Today there are six (6) well filled classes each receiving two lessons a week. Another one organized to start in a few days. This work could be extended very much if there were more accommodation, apparatus, etc.

A little over a year ago a library was started. There are present in the library 685 volumes, standard works. This is a very popular branch of the work there being no fewer than 340 persons who are using it. This library should be very much enlarged and at least 2000 volumes in it. This would be done at once if the means were only forthcoming.

The Reading Room, the only branch of the work that was maintained in the past is still well supplied with the standard publication. There are to be found in it 61 periodicals at an annual cost of \$142. And persons have been heard to complain of the cost when asked to buy a \$3.00 ticket giving them access to all those periodicals and also to the Library.

Many unsuccessful attempts had been made in the past to interest the students of the college in the work of the Y. M. C. A. and provide for them that wholesome recreation, which they perhaps more than any other body of young persons need. This year more success has attended the efforts and a student organization or club has been formed meeting weekly and embracing a majority of the students attending Prince of Wales College. Of all branches of work undertaken by the Y. M. C. A. none equal in importance the Boys' Work. Save the boys and the problem of winning back the young men will not need to be faced. Keep the boys interested in that which is good, and the problem of a clean young manhood is practically solved.

Hitherto the Charlottetown Y. M. C. A. found it impossible to do any practical work for the boys. Attempts have been made and failed. No branch of the work today is so encouraging as the Boys' Branch. So much has this work developed that it became absolutely necessary to engage a special Boys' Secretary. The Executive have been fortunate in being able to secure for the position so efficient an officer as H. H. Hamilton. The problem of procuring more accommodation for this branch of the work will soon have to be faced.

The social side of the work is being well looked after. The large Reading Room has been taken for a Recreation Room, fitted up with games, a piano has been purchased and other attractive features added. To effect this change the parlor had to be taken for a Reading Room. This room while smaller than the one previously used is comfortable and cosy and readers will not suffer any discomfort from the change.

The improvement made in our Y. M. C. A. is very largely due to the energy and efficiency of the General Secretary A. W. Robb. He has been ably assisted by an energetic and devoted executive committee who have given much time, thought and prayer to the work of the Y. M. C. A. The ladies also have contributed very much indeed. They have raised a great deal of money and expended it in making the rooms more comfortable—putting in sewerage—and donating sums to the executive to meet running expenses. Without the aid of the ladies it would have been impossible to accomplish what has been done.

Much attention has been paid to the spiritual work. Sunday afternoon meetings have been held throughout the year and have been well attended. Bible classes are being organized among the young men and boys. Special religious services are held by the boys with encouraging results.

To meet the demands of the work

already undertaken \$2500 per year is required. To raise this sum it is necessary for the executive to appeal to the Christian community. During the next few days members of the executive will call upon the citizens. In view of the work undertaken and the necessity for organizing it let there be a generous response.
