WINNING THE DERBY.

Richard Crocker, a former Tammany Boss, who was at one time supposed to "run" New York, has been for some years residing in England and Ireland, having abdicated his political throne in a democratic land for the peace and harmony of a life under an effete monarchy, as spread-eagle orators sometimes call the British Kingdom.

He has again sprung into the bright light of fame through his horse having won the Derby the greatest annual event in English annals—an achievement which has always heretofore carried with it a certain amount of popularity in the regard of the British lovers of sport. No doubt he would rather have "won the Derby" than to be reinstated as the boss of Tammany Hall.

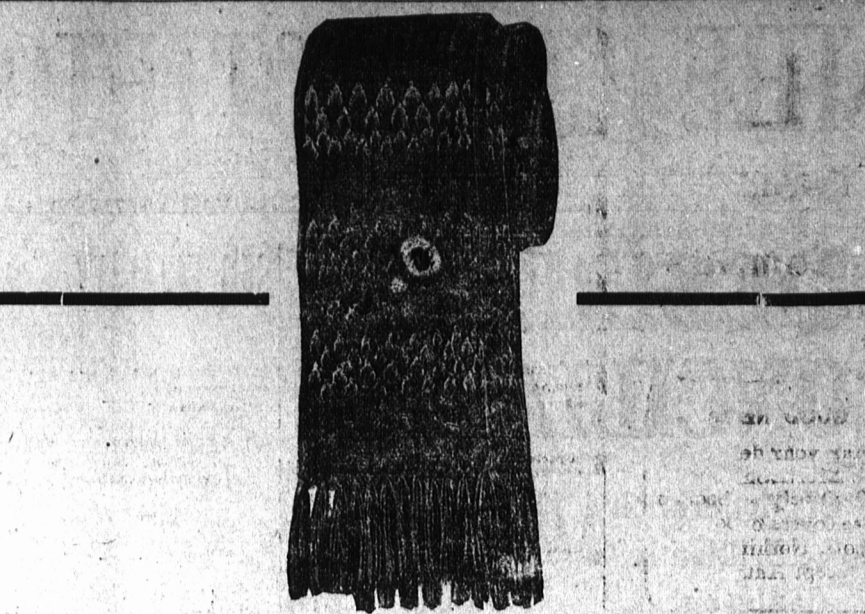

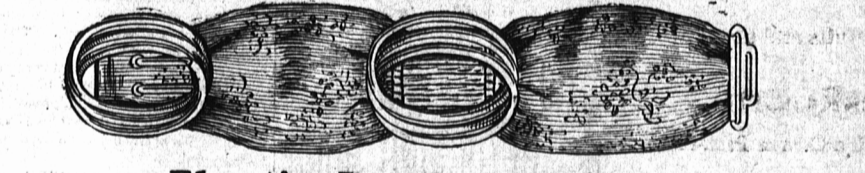

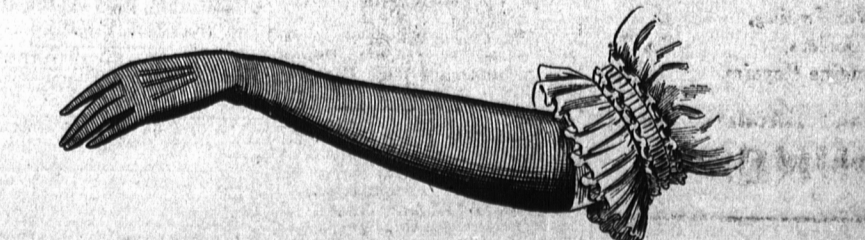
