The cause of numerous diseases and disfiguring habits heretofore ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Hindrances, drooping, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one side and halting are very often due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth irritate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. These cases should be removed. Decayed teeth should be removed by extracting or grinding, all rough edges and sharp corners should be smoothed down and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The sensitive lining of the teeth should be protected by a special preparation.


