Hockey Scout Who Discovered Shore Passes

(By The Canadian Press) MELVILLE, N.S., June 27—Goldie Smith, 50, Melville's postmaster who started Eddie Shore on the road to hockey greatness and handed dozens of other stars, died today from a spinal hemorrhage.

Smith was perhaps the first to see in the youthful Shore many of the possibilities. He went over to see him and brought him back to Melville in 1923. There played a season under Smith who then took him to Regina where Shore signed his first professional contract with the Regina Capitals of the old Western Canada League.

For many years a scout for National Hockey League teams, Smith always considered Shore his greatest find. But in recent years he sent Detroit Red Wings several crack players, notably Modere Bruneteau, Wilf Cude, Montreal Canadiens' goaltender, and Alex Motter.
