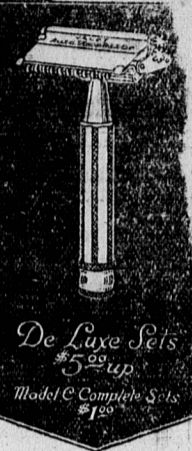

### RELIGIOUS WORK

It has always been the policy of the Y. M. C. A. to recognize the medium of religious instruction. The Churches' policy of co-operation has continued and our Association is feeling the whole-hearted support that is given by the Ministers and their Churches.  
 It has always been our desire to maintain in our program that Christian ideal which will permit all our work and make it a high character building process.

### SUNDAY EVENING SERVICES

Our Sunday evening services have been very successful this year and much credit is due Mr. E. Bentley for his untiring services, as he has been present at nearly all the meetings and has worked faithfully in their behalf as has Mr. R. H. McNeill, our religious work chairman.  
 Very fine order has been maintained this year and a varied program has been put on as follows: one night a month was set aside as Musical Night; three illustrated lectures were very well received and provided something different; we were very fortunate in being able to secure during the season some ten or more outstanding speakers from all over Canada.  
 Attendance right from the start was not encouraging and during the seven months the meetings have been going, an average attendance of 245 was maintained. Throughout the season a grand total of 5906 attended the 24 meetings.

### FOREIGN WORK

Our Association, through interested members, subscribed \$300.00 to this Missionary work of the Young Men's Christian Association in foreign lands. If there is any one special phase of Association work to be proud of it is the work in non-Christian lands.  
 Mr. Trueman, of Nagoya, Japan, one of our own Canadian boys, was our special visitor in the interest of Foreign Work.

### BOYS' WORK

Our boys work program this year has been considerably enlarged and changed around somewhat, the general plan of a four-fold work has been followed out.  
 Boys naturally crave for the social and physical program that keeps them in action and therefore a varied and changing program was necessary to keep them interested.

Special work for the Boys was as follows: gym classes twice a week; basketball or apparatus an extra period each week; the game and social rooms open all day and Friday and Saturday nights for Juniors.  
 Radio, gramophone and piano supplied the music during the spare hours. Monthly socials with eats were quite the favorite. Educational moving pictures and slides

The work of this department of our Association will be reported on in full by its chairman, Mr. J. A. McMillan, whose report will show that a larger number than ever attended gym classes, and that this work is gradually enlarging and extending its influence.

As usual, this work took the form of lectures to the general membership, the student body, and the Y's Mens' Club.  
 The reading room has a still larger number of papers and magazines than last year and is still a very popular room. During the summer it was completely renovated and all the chairs newly upholstered. The improvement is indeed very noticeable.

### LOCKERS AND SHOWERS.

During the year your Assistant Secretary assisted the students in the following ways:  
 Organizing and conducting—ten socials, eight hikes, two toboggan parties, one sleigh drive, one skating party.

Those took place on Saturday nights, which night the programme is entirely for the student body.  
 Conducted four gym exhibitions—one in Menzies, one in Hunter River, two in our own gym.  
 Organized and assisted in five Sunday Morning trips under the direction of the Y's Mens' Club to the Protestant Orphanage, where religious services were held for the kiddies and Staff.

Assisted in conducting sports at a Community Picnic at Hunter River.  
 Attended Y. M. C. A. Summer School during the summer at Lake Couchiching, Ont.  
 Gave talks to two different organizations on physical training.

Conducted a physical training display as part of the New Year's Programme.  
 Organized three Junior Toboggan parties, four skating parties to some of the Rural Rinks, one Senior Sleigh drive.

Assisted in programme at eight various Church Socials by organizing and conducting group games.  
 Officiated at two Boys' Ice Racing Meets, at the local Arena.  
 Trained a group of Prince St. School girls for a physical training display at the Prince Street School Concert. This group also took part in the program of the Short Course closing and the Trinity C. G. I. T. Demonstration, also our own gym exhibition. Many complimentary remarks have been heard of the very efficient manner in which they have executed their drills.

Organized and conducted a hobby show of rabbits for Junior Members. Over 100 rabbits were shown and thirty odd boys exhibited their wares.  
 Conducted a Boys' Camp at Canoe Cove, where 28 of our Boys spent a most enjoyable vacation at a very moderate cost. It is the intention to conduct another camp

on similar lines during the ensuing summer.
