EGG SHIPMENTS.—Some of the egg dealers were in consultation with Mr. T. B. Grady, Superintendent of the P. E. I. R., yesterday afternoon with reference to the shipping of eggs. It was pointed out that the Express Companies are at present utterly unable to handle large shipments. Mr. Grady promised that the matter would be remedied by the providing of lined and refrigerator cars to Borden and the points beyond.

MEDAL RECEIVED.—Sergeant Harry A. McDougall, 2nd Canadian Siege Battery, C. F. A., who will be remembered as the courteous clerk at Patons, Ltd., has sent home the Military Medal won by him at the front. It is a beautiful silver medal, bearing on one side the King and his inscription as King of Great Britain and Ireland and Emperor of India. On the other side is the British crest and below it the words: "For Bravery in the Field." This is surrounded with the Maple Wreath. The gallant young officer is still in France.
