Nomination List Record For Quebec

QUEBEC, Oct. 18 — (CP) — A record number of candidates, representing a dozen political shades, will contest the Provincial Election next Wednesday when Premier Maurice Duplessis's Union Nationale Government meets its first major test since it broke a 40-year Liberal rule in 1936.

When official nominations closed at 2 P. M. EST. today there were 251 candidates in the field to seek election in 85 of the 86 Legislative seats. Candidates nominated today joined 11 others who filed their papers and deposits last Saturday in the remote constituencies of Abitibi, Magdalen Islands and Temiscouingue. Candidates remain to be named officially in the sparsely-settled Charlevoix-Saguenay division where the list closes Oct. 27 with voting Nov. 1.

The figures to date—which top the 1936 record of 206 candidates—include 86 Union Nationale representatives, 55 Liberals, 56 Action Libérale candidates and 24 others bearing various political labels.

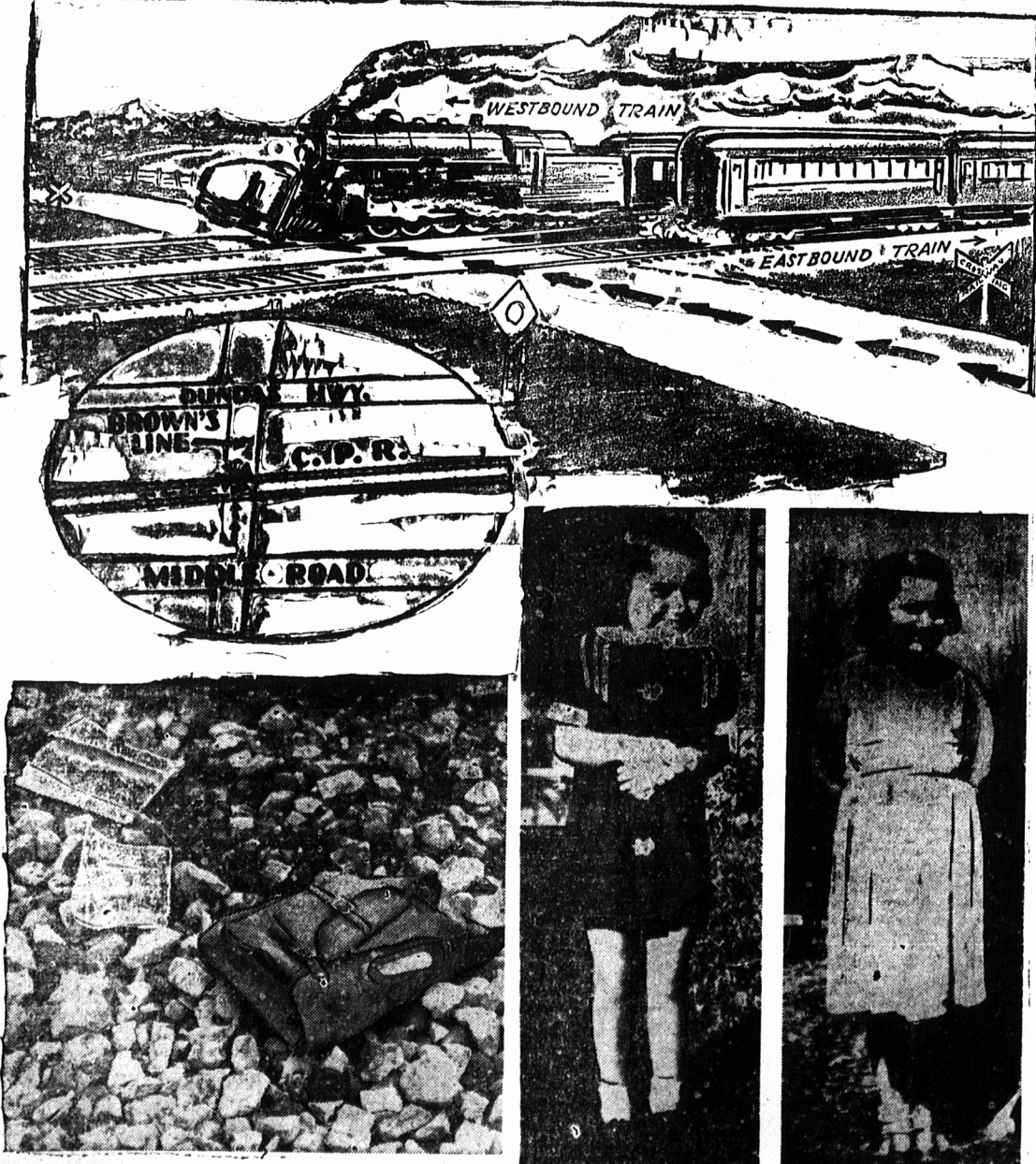

The above drawing shows how two women and seven children met death when their motor car was struck by a C.P.R. train on the crossing at Brown's Line, near Dixie, Ont. It is reported that the driver had stopped the car to wait for an eastbound train to pass, and then started across in front of the westbound train. The inset map shows where the accident occurred. Also shown is the school bag of one of the children, its contents spilled along the near Eaton farm at Islington, are shown here. Left to right, they are Vera, 6, and Gladys, 10, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. T. H. Davis. The car was being driven by Mrs. Gordon Brown, who was killed with her two daughters, Marlan and Dorothy.

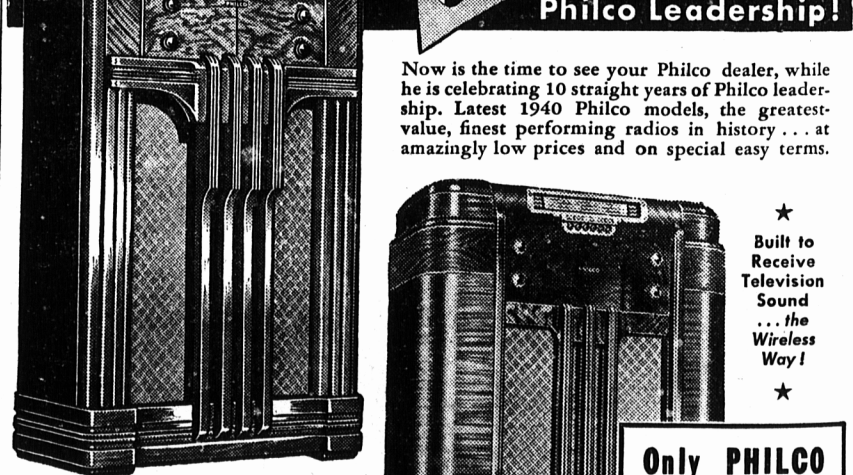
