Railway Authorities Unsympathetic Towards Truck Rate Reduction

Unsympathetic attitude towards suggested reduction in truck rates on the Borden-Tormentine ferry on the part of railway authorities was revealed in the report of the agricultural committee of the Summerside Board of Trade at its annual meeting Tuesday night. The report, submitted by Chairman T. J. Inman, read as follows:

As agriculture is the basic industry of our Province the prosperity of the Town as well as the country depends to a large extent on the prices received for farm products.

The farming population of Canada according to 1941 census is 3,163,000 or a little over 33 1/2 per cent. They only receive 20 per cent of the National Revenue.

This shows the large increase going to the provinces with manufacturing and the fact that the Edward Island along with other agricultural provinces bearing the brunt of the increase.

This part of P. E. Island is also handicapped on account of exorbitant rates charged on trucks going into other provinces. The work of the same as a prohibitive tariff against our farmers.

EGG PRODUCTION INCREASE.—Egg production in Prince Edward Island continues to increase. It was announced yesterday by Mr. F.C. Ward, Poultry Products Inspector, Charlottetown. He said the first crop of eggs for export is being assembled here this week. Large grading stations are quoting for ungraded eggs delivered to the market as follows: A-l, 30-35; A-2, 25-30; A-3, 20-25; A-4, 15-20; A-5, 10-15; A-6, 5-10; A-7, 0-5.
