Stock Market Trend Reflects Peace Hopes

(By Frederick Gardner) (Associated Press Market Writer) NEW YORK, Sept. 7.—Visions of a peaceful solution of the German minority issue in Czechoslovakia interrupted the stock market's slumbers today and sent prices higher in a short-lived buying rush. Large buying orders swept pivotal shares upward for gains ranging to more than 2 points. The stock ticker for a time was overtaken by the dealings and dropped in arrears a minute or two. Gains were pared a bit before the close. The Associated Press composite price of 80 stocks ended 3/4 of a point higher at 492. Transactions totaled 892,460 shares against 414,560 yesterday. Nearly a third of the day's dealings were compressed within about half an hour following the flare-up of peace hopes. Fractional gains were general among Canadian stocks, with Distillers-Seagrams, Dome, International Nickel, McIntyre, Walkers, Ford, Lake Shore and Massey Harris improving slightly. Industrial Alcohol and Hollinger eased. Trade news, however, continued to take a back seat while the financial district concentrated on European dispatches. Up 1 to more than 2 points at the finish were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Western Union, Santa Fe, Standard Oil of New Jersey, Chrysler, U. S. Rubber, International Harvester, Westinghouse Electric, Goodyear and American Smelting. Utilities mostly lagged.

Bullish Trend On Montreal Stock Market

MONTREAL, Sept. 7.—(CP)—Rumors concerning the Czech-Sudeten negotiations sent the stock market soaring during the last hour's trading today. Equipment, paper and metals were the first to reflect the bullish tendencies. Traders chased National Steel Car up 2 3/4 points, Canadian Car and Dominion Tar and Dominion Steel and coal "B" nearly a point, Massey-Harris about a half and General Steel wares 1-8. Noran shot up 2 points to 73 1/2. Nickel one to 50 and Hudson Bay 1-4 to 30. Consolidated Smelters recovered from an earlier half-point decline and closed 3-8 points higher at 27 1/2. Papers snapped out of their opening calmness with a 2 1/2 point advance for St. Lawrence Paper preferred, about a point each for St. Lawrence Corporation preferred and Price Brothers, and 3-4 for Bathurst. Among the constructions, Dominion Bridge climbed 1-2, Dominion Tar and United Steel small fractions while Cement and Gypsum drifted lower. Utilities were steady. Total sales: 76,800 shares; Industrials, 25,300; Mines, 51,300; bonds \$3,050.

MONTREAL, Sept. 7.—(CP)—Receipts of top-grade eggs were not sufficient to cover the demand on open produce markets today according to Department of Agriculture reports and prices for class standard and extra class eggs were unchanged. The Canadian dollar was up 3/2 of a cent at 99 3/4.

MONTREAL, Sept. 7.—(CP)—Receipts on Montreal markets: Cattle, 276; hogs 180; sheep and lambs 253. The receipts of cattle were made up of medium to good quality steers and of cows. Prices were unchanged. Good steers sold from \$6.25 up with medium kinds from \$5.25 to \$6. A few good heifers sold up to \$5.50. Good butcher cows, pastured, \$4.25 to \$4.75; medium from \$3.50 to \$4.25 and common butchers \$3 to \$3.50. Common bulls brought \$3 to \$3.50. Calves were firm. Good quality veals sold up to \$9.25. Medium to good kinds in mixed lots selling at \$9 and common light veals down to \$8. Grassers were \$4.50 to \$5, mostly \$4.75 to \$5. Good ewes and wethers were \$8 to \$8.50. Culls and bucks were cut \$2 per cwt. Sheep were from \$2.50 to \$4.50. Hogs were unchanged at \$9.75 for bacon fed and watered, with truck hogs selling up to \$10. Selected drew \$1 per hog premium, with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were from \$7 to \$8.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$13.50 dressed weight. On Maritime markets hog prices were unchanged. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.50, with sows at \$5.75. Finance

NEW YORK, Sept. 7.—(AP)—Short-covering and Canadian wheat export business estimated at nearly 1,000,000 bushels swung Winnipeg wheat futures and most other gains more than a cent higher today. At the final bell wheat prices were 1-2-1 3-4 cents higher, Oct. 59, Nov. 59 3-8, Dec. 58 7-8 and May 62 3-4-7-8. A seven downward trend which placed futures at lows untouched in five years was blocked chiefly by unsettled European political news based on the Czechoslovakian crisis. The market tumbled fractionally at the start in sympathy with lower Liverpool cables but selling tapered as the session advanced. Cash wheat spreads eased slightly with volume of business small. Exporters and Millers took small quantities of Nos. 1 and 2 northern grades. All coarse grains except flax scored gains of a cent or more with southern interests buyers of barley in drive. Flax which slipped five cents yesterday continued weak and near the close was off 1-2 cents.
