## OVERFLOW QUEENS COUNTY

When the ice boats were ordered into service last week at the 'Capes' to transport the mail and passengers, only nine boats were put to work. On the representation of Postmaster Whelan, two more boats were put on a few days afterward and another boat has since been added, making the total number now at work twelve. There are now lying over at Cape Tormentine, the accumulation of what the boats have had to leave from day to day, about sixty bags of mail. If the weather keeps fine it is hoped that these will all be brought over now that a dozen boats and crews are at work, but if regular trips are prevented further delays in clearing up the balance left over will occur.

The death took place at Gledonia, March 5th, of Margaret Cameron, wife of the late Duncan Cameron, in the 91st year of her age. Her health has been admirably good up to the time of her death. She was born in Isle of Skye, Scotland, and removed to this Island when twenty years of age. Her days had been concentrated to her Maker, and lived a model life. Her children are: Donald Cameron, a graduate of P. W. C. and Queen's University and was a prominent member of the Gledonia Club, the Abegweit Football Team, and won the all-around athletic championship at Queen's University each successive year of his attendance, some years ago. He died when about to enter upon his postural labors; John D., who travelled extensively for an American firm through Canada and the United States, who also pre-deceased her; John M. Gledonia (with whom she resided for the last few years), Alex, contractor, Sydney C. B. and Mrs. A. Bonnell Charlottetown.

LATEST information received from Dr. Toombs last night was to the effect that 10 houses were flagged yesterday in this district where varioloid has broken out. These cases are in the Dromore and Auburn settlements. There is said to be absolutely no truth in the report that a case was discovered at Fort Augustus yesterday. To day Dr. Toombs will go down to the centre of the affected district and will stay there for two or three days in which time he hopes to have all the infected house, flagged and by applying preventive measure, in every case where there are symptoms of the disease it is thought that very soon it will disappear. To-day the Government will receive the report of the two City Doctors who yesterday went down to investigate the illness, with a view to determining what it is. Many of the patients resolutely declare that the disease is nothing of any consequence and are indignant as being classed as smallpox or varioloid sufferers. In the case of most of those being ill they have not even gone to bed.

Rev. Wm. Dobson gave the address at the evangelistic service in Zion Church last night. He put things in his usual clear cut, straight forward way. He said, "sin is missing the mark; to fail to glorify God is missing the mark; or as Paul put it, 'Whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.' Transgression is a stepping over the law of God. Iniquity has the thought of doing things unbecomingly to have the same consideration for others as we have for ourselves. If we are conscious of having come short so that one or all of these conditions are true of us we adjudge ourselves guilty before God. 'And truly as the Scripture says—all we like sheep have gone astray, but we may also believe that the latter part of the verse is also true, 'The Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all.' If our iniquity is laid on him it can no longer be on us. Therefore if with all our heart we believe in Jesus Christ and are ready to confess Him we have, now everlasting life as soon as we believe." Rev. Mr. Robertson followed up with an invitation to 'Decision for Christ now. Three persons responded to the invitation and came out into the light in the enquiry room. The after service was well attended and a great many took part. The meetings will be held tonight as usual.

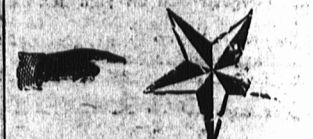
