Pressure Builds Up On Steel Prices

CLEVELAND, June 22 — (AP)—Declaring that "inflationary forces" are "pressing for release" in the steel markets, the magazine Steel today summarized the situation by stating: "With demand taxing mill production facilities to the limit, a new show of price strength in basic steelmaking materials, such as scrap, coke and pig iron, is lending an added push to the upward pressure on the finished steel price structure." The trade journal also reported advances in scrap prices were continuing in the east and at Chicago and predicted broad increases in the pig iron market, "possibly within the next 30 to 60 days." At the same time, "Beehive coke prices advanced in a buoyant market and tungsten ore was quoted several dollars per ton above recent price levels." The weekly index of steelmaking remained unchanged at 96.5 per cent of rated capacity.

Presidential Vetoes Fail To Keep N. Y. Stock Prices Down

NEW YORK, June 22 — (AP)—Presidential vetoes of income tax reduction and labor bills failed to keep the stock market from registering an advance last week. Customers hopeful for an extension of the June rally bid favorably. The issues higher late in the week after three days of aimless drifting. The Associated Press 60-stock composite moved ahead .8 of a point during the week to 64.1, its highest level since last April 7. It was the fifth successive week in which it either advanced or held even with the close of the preceding week. Not since the five-week period ended May 5, 1945, had the average equalled this performance. Activity picked up also, total transactions of 4,710,610 shares comparing with 4,560,400 in the preceding week. Industrial and rail issues led the upturn. An outstanding dissenter was American Telephone Common which slid to a new 1947 low at 149 3-4 on Thursday after a four-point dip Wednesday when the company called for redemption by Sept. 2 of some \$38,000,000 of convertible bonds. This move was expected to force conversion of the debentures and increase the amount of common stock outstanding for the Chamber, by which the plan has been prepared, says the idea is to persuade South Africans to "buy South African" rather than imported goods, and thus support home industries.

Russia Makes Bid To Boost Steel Output

WASHINGTON, June 22 — (AP)—Senator Edward Martin (Rep.-Pa.) pictured Russia Saturday as "making a great effort" to build up her steel industry for a possible challenge to America's production leadership. Martin, who is directing a special United States Senate inquiry into the steel industry, told a reporter he "is worried about this." "We gave Russia some of our most modern steel production equipment during the war when she was our ally and Germany had destroyed many of her plants." He added that steel industry leaders and Government authorities believe Russia now is "only about one-sixth as efficient in steel production" as the United States. As chairman of the Senate small business sub-committee holding hearings on steel, Martin said he has learned that "Russia is accumulating all possible wartime scrap."
