DOMINION DAY 240 TROT

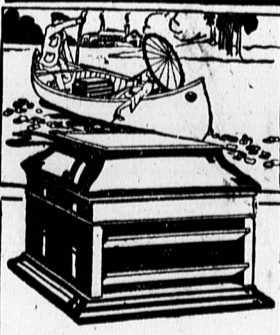
