A Politician Says Quebec is Too Religious

MONTREAL, Nov. 25 - Hon. Jacques Bureau, the new solicitor-general, indicated at a dinner given in his honor on Saturday night by the Montreal Reform Club that the next great work to be undertaken by the dominion government would be the construction of the Georgian Bay canal.

A somewhat sensational speech was made by Hon. W. A. Weir, provincial treasurer, who remarked that in the past Quebec had paid too much attention to "religion and kingdom come" instead of the kingdom they already had to develop.

THE DEPOSED PRESIDENT OF BOROUGH BANK
