**Bullish Sentiment Weakens At N. Y.**

NEW YORK, June 12.—(AP)—Many pivotal issues retreated in the stock market today although enough bullish sentiment remained to give the list a spotty appearance.

Losses ranging from more than a point were registered by leading stocks, notably rubbers and some other industries. Selective demand kept a few favorites well forward.

The session started at an active pace but slowed in the afternoon and transfers totalled 11,040,000 shares against 1,350,000 on Wednesday's rally.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite declined 2 of a point to 62.6.

Plus signs prevailed throughout the day in the Canadian group, the advance being led by McIntyre which posted a two-point gain. Dome Mines was up 5-8 and Lake Shore 3-4. In the liquor division, Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram each gained 1-4.

American Telephone which lagged behind Wednesday's upswing dipped today to a new 1947 low, trading ex-dividend to close off 1 7-8 at 157 3-4. Chrysler was down 2 at 103. Others a point or more lower included the recently rising Texas Pacific Land Trust at 23. U. S. Steel at 36 1-2, Youngstown Sheet at 59 1-2, Goodyear at 3-4, Montgomery Ward at 56 1-2, J. C. Case at 33 3-4 and American Can at 93.

22,500 shares of Consolidated Central Cadillac being traded before closing at a 4 cent loss. Sherritt-Gordon lost 10 cents.

**Pluses And Minuses Evenly Distributed On Montreal Market**

MONTREAL, June 12.—(CP)—

Pluses and minuses were evenly distributed over a narrow list in conservative dealings on the stock exchange and curb market today.

The exchange closing index listed papers off 2.37 to 316.84; industrials off 1 to 120.3; utilities up 2 to 77.7; golds up .08 to 75.0 and banks off .08 to 27.12. Volume increased slightly over yesterday with 45,800 industrial and 121,900 mining shares being traded.

Algonia led the industrial group gaining up 1 1-2 at 30 and Royalite advanced 1 3-8 closing at 20 7-8. Canadian Locomotive added a point at 26 1-2 and Massey Harris a similar amount at 17 1-2. Others ahead were Canada Cement up 3-4 at 18 1-4 and Canada Cement Pfd up 1-4 at 31 1-2. Canadian Car also added 1-4 closing at 12 1-2.

Losses in the industrial group included Canada Car "A" off 1-4 at 17 and Pleet down 1-8.

All of the more active paper leaders closed on the down side despite their strong showing in earlier trading. However losses were mainly fractional. Brown closed at 4 5-8 off 1-4 and International closed at 45 1-2 off 3-8. Abitibi maintained an early loss of 1-4 until the close while Domacoma was off 1-2.

The oil groups were generally brighter with three new highs reached among the more active traders. B. A. advanced 5-8 at 26, Calgary and Edmonton reached a new high of 2.50 for a gain of 20 cents. Dalhousie closed at new peak of 65 up 15 cents while British Dominion added 3 cents at 28. Homestead closed at 54 1-2 up 1-2. Only dull spots in oils was McColl Frontenac down 5-8 at 28.

The utilities showed more activity and leaders were generally stronger. International closed at 102 up 1-4 and Shawinigan closed at 2 5-8 up 1-8.

Canadian Breweries advanced 1-8 in beverages at 24 5-8 while Seagraves closed unchanged after losing an earlier gain of 1-4. Carriers were quiet, with C. P. R. closing unchanged after an early gain of 1-4. Consolidated Smelting was the only active member of the metal family closing unchanged at 83.
