AROUND THE FUR RANCHES

As already indicated in these columns, if other lines of business, especially stock investments, have been suffering from the effects of the European war, not so the fox industry but is in fact still in a normal condition but is in fact still steadily going ahead in its development. AN ISLAND BOY.—The Moncton Daily Times reproduces photographs of the boys who have volunteered to go to the front. Under Capt. Wm. A. McKee's photo appears the following: "Capt. McKee, who is also Adjutant of the 4th Brigade of New Brunswick has seen active service, being a South African war veteran. He began his military career as a member of the Medical Corps at Charlottetown and afterwards was promoted to officer of the 2nd Regiment. While a resident of Charlottetown he joined the second Canadian Mounted Rifles and went to South Africa, receiving a medal with three bars. After his return he continued in the 19th Field Battery in 1908 as Captain. In 1911, he was chosen as one of the officers from New Brunswick to the coronation of King George, and on the trip he was Adjutant of Field Artillery. Early this year he was appointed Adjutant of the 4th Brigade. This appointment he is to fill until Major Anleson's promotion, when he will receive the rank of Major."
