ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

THE Princess is expected to leave for Picton this morning.

MANY friends will regret to hear that George Wright of Montague is very ill with pneumonia.

It is probable that the Budget speech will be delivered in the Legislature on Tuesday or Wednesday next.

MAILS will go by the Minto to Picton this morning and will come to the city via Georgeown to which port the Stanley will cross from Picton today.

A BILL asking for an amendment to the School Act in order that the School Board may increase their estimates will be presented to the Legislature shortly.

T. A. McLEAN has retired from the Fort Augustus district where he had been chosen Liberal Conserver candidate and another Convention will be held.

JOHN McKezic who had been creating trouble in Wood Islands was brought to the city Saturday, arraigned before Stipendiary Blanchard and ordered to be taken to the Asylum.

IN Zion Church yesterday morning the pulpit was occupied by Rev. T. F. Fullerton and in the evening by T. C. James, Rev. W. W. Lodge and Rev. G. R. White also exchanged pulpits.

REV. JAMES Simpson leaves this morning for Halifax where he will attend the Diocesan Synod of the Church of England which meets there Wednesday. The Synod usually meets in June but next Sunday is the last in which the present Bishop Courtney will occupy his office it is thus called earlier. Another meeting will be held in June at which a successor to Bishop Courtney will be elected. Mrs. Simpson accompanies Rev. Mr. Simpson to Halifax.

REV. G. M. Young last night preached one of the most eloquent sermons heard in the church for a long time. It was a temperance sermon and a stirring reference was made to the local conditions. The reverend gentleman impressed upon the citizens the need of assistance in enforcing the Prohibition Act and incidentally pointed out that if the money paid to the detective referred to at Saturday's meeting who had visited many of the liquor saloons in the city had been used to close these saloons it would be well spent.

HENRY PALMER who broke jail about a year ago and went to another province returned home a few days since and was captured in bed at his home near the jail early yesterday morning by officers Bradley and Harper.

THE old Protestant cemetery on Malpeque road will this summer be put in good condition after many years of neglect. This cemetery is one of the oldest in the province and is a most interesting spot to visit.

SPECIAL services will be conducted in the Baptist Church on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings at which Rev. J. Harry King, Summerside will assist. On Tuesday evening a congregational meeting will be held to consider the building of a parsonage.

THE first fruits of the electric wire inspection were seen in the First Methodist Church last night. The wiring had been pronounced defective and as a consequence the church had to be lighted last evening by lamps. No services will be held in the church this week.

DR. J. G. TOOMBS drove to the City yesterday from Mount Stewart and leaves this morning for Ottawa. Dr. Toombs will be the representative of the Provincial Government at the convention to be held at the Capital this week to consider tuberculosis and other infectious diseases.

THE Guardian with many other friends extends deep sympathy to William deers, Kingston on the death of his daughter, Mrs. Maynew in Calgary, which was announced by telegram Saturday. The deceased had gone west last fall for the benefit of her health. The remains will be brought home.

THE Minto arrived at four o'clock Saturday having been detained all day between Point Prim and the Blockhouse owing to the snowstorm. Her cargo included 1 car tin, 1 car seeds, 2 cars flour, 1 car sugar, and 1000 packages way freight. There were also 33 passengers and 88 bags of mail.

A TELEGRAM received in the City Saturday evening stated that the Aurora which had gone from St. John's Nfld., to relieve the crew of the Elliot at St. Paul's Island had returned. The Elliot was a total loss. The telegram did not say whether Capt. McMillan and the crew had returned to St. John's but it is presumed they were on board the Aurora.
