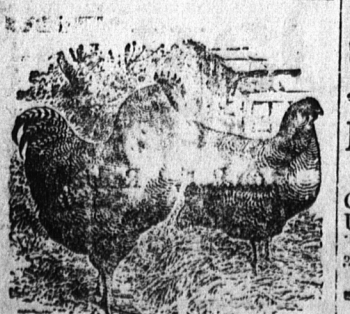

MAKING GLOBE MAPS

A decided filip to a little known industry has been given by the war. Hitherto globe maps, to be seen in every schoolroom, were made in Germany, there being very few firms in Britain who manufactured them. The consequence was that English retailers had to sell thousands of German globes every year not only in their own country, but in the do-globes were more expensive, but were decidedly superior to those made in Germany, which were of poor workmanship, and now that the German trade has been killed a determined attempt is to be made to capture the whole of the trade. Few people could say of what substance globes are made, and would be astonished to hear that brown paper was the chief material used. A matrix of wood is covered with strips of brown paper which have been well smeared with paste. The paper is laid on the matrix until it is about a sixteenth of an inch thick, and the globe looks like a football of the association type. When this paper covering is dry it is out midway between what will be the two poles, removed from the matrix, and after an axis has been fixed in it, the two hemispheres are glued together. Then this sphere of paper is coated with a composition plaster, the ingredients of which are a trade secret, and again left to dry.

After being tested to see that it is an exact sphere, the meridians are marked on the globe to guide the girls who finish the work. The globe is then fixed in a clamp which holds its axis and a girl takes the engraved gores, cut ready for use, and pastes them on without overlapping. If the globe is exact the gores should fit so exactly that you can not see where they are in the completed globe.

PNEUMATIC TAMPERS

Machines to Take the Place of Old-fashioned Bars.

Old, stilted hand bars which by cheap labor are being replaced by pneumatic machines in both railroad and building construction. After the ties of a railway line have been laid, the tamping operation is as essential as are the ties. It has been customary for small gangs of men to go up and down carrying a heavy bar and drop rhythmically, packing the sand and gravel firmly about each tie. The operation never ceases, for heavy rolling stock shakes up the roadbed and loosens the ties. The new pneumatic machine which gives one hundred strokes to the minute, each stroke an inch and a quarter long, dispenses with this handwork. Power of seventy and ninety pounds pressure is taken from the regular locomotive air brake line.

By cutting down labor costs in such a way, the pneumatic tampers make it possible for railroads to improve branch and secondary lines. This prospect of having roadbeds throughout the country as good as those of the best main lines is a most attractive feature of the possibilities afforded by the machine.

For building operations a similar machine has been put into service.—Technical World Magazine.
