NO ORIENTAL EXCLUSION LAW

SEATTLE, Wash., Feb. 23. The Seattle Chamber of Commerce today addressed a memorial to President Roosevelt and Secretary Root to the effect that its members believe that a majority of the people of the Pacific Coast are not in favor of any immigration law that will treat the people of Japan differently from the inhabitants of any European country. This letter is sent to correct an erroneous impression of the attitude of the commercial and other important interests the memorial says, owing to the action of a recent convention of Oriental exclusionists held in Seattle.
