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PROTEST AGAINST EXCHANGE BASIS FOR GERMAN BANK

British Claim That the Experts' Plan Would Be Jeopardized By The American Scheme.

(United Press) LONDON, July 21.—Responsible financial quarters here believe the establishment of Germany's proposed note-issuing bank on a gold-exchange basis would be sufficient in itself, to wreck the entire experts' reparations plan.

On Patriotic Grounds Newspaper writers and politicians have tangled their comment with sentimental and patriotic arguments. In their exuberance, they have even gone so far as to declare unequivocally that New York's Wall Street does not possess sufficient knowledge, experience or facilities to de throne London's city.

A tour of authoritative banking houses and expert financial quarters reveals that there is a sound, determined opposition here to the American suggestion as regards the proposed German bank.

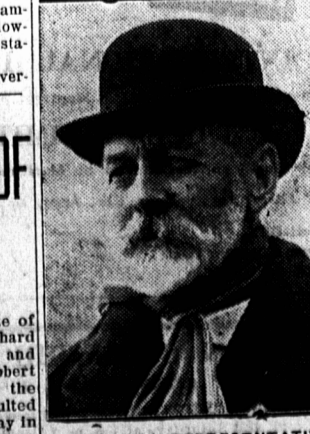

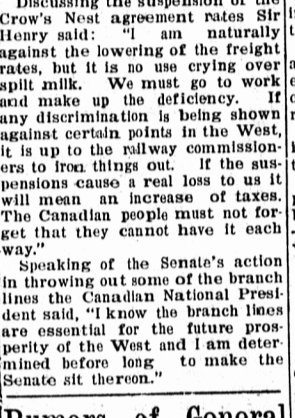
The Rum Vendors Will Face Death
