THE MARKETS

MONTREAL, July 12.—There was no important change in the condition of the local market for eggs yesterday, the feeling being about steady for all grades with a fair amount of business passing for immediate consumption, but owing to the very warm weather prevailing the demand was chiefly for small lots.

We quote wholesale jobbing prices as follows: Specials 43c. to 44c. Extras 40c. to 42c. No. 1, candled stock 34c. to 35c. No. 2, candled stock 31c. to 32c.

The market for maple product was without any new feature to note, business being still very quiet as is usual at this period of the year, and in consequence the demand was limited and prices nominally unchanged with maple syrup quoted at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per gallon, and maple sugar at 15c. to 20c. per lb., as to quantity.
