Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon a cultivated section of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.

Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

SPECIAL RESEARCH WORK FOR CANADA

The Hon. Martin Burrell, Minister of Agriculture, has authorized the appointment of Assistant Professor of Biology of Macdonald College, W. P. Fraser, M. A., in connection with the special investigations on grain rust to be conducted at the recently erected field laboratories at Brandon, Man., and Indian Head, Sask. This appointment has been made in consideration and anticipation of the claims of our Western farmers, who have suffered serious losses from the uncontrolled ravages of this wide-spread disease of grain. The average annual loss throughout the world from rust exceeds \$100,000,000, but in years when the disease appears epidemically, as in 1904 and 1916, losses for Canada and the U. S. A. alone amounted to nearly \$230,000,000 (\$180,000,000 actual report from U. S. A. and \$100,000,000 estimated for Canada). From these figures it will be seen how very important every effort must appear directed against the losses from this source in the future.

Mr. Fraser, according to the opinion of eminent professional authorities on the subject of plant diseases, is looked upon as the best qualified and experienced person on rust investigation that could be secured for this work, even if we had the choice from the available men in the U. S. A. and Canada.

Mr. Fraser is a Canadian by birth.

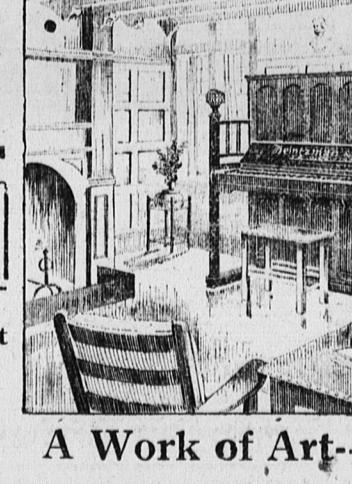
