—SUMMERSIDE POST OFFICE.—Mr. H. P. Woods, the contractor for the additions and alterations to be made to the Summerside Post Office is making preparations to commence work. The contract includes the building of a brick extension at the east side of the building, one-story high, 38 feet long and 13 feet wide, this extra room, being required by the Postmaster, in order properly to handle the mail matter. The network will also comprise the placing of a new copper roof on the whole building. This part of the contract has been sublet to Hon. J. E. Wilson, of St. John, as also a metal ceiling in the main office. The plans also call for a complete re-modelling of the electric lighting system of the building. Although Mr. Woods' contract does not call for any alterations to the interior of the office yet it is expected that when the present work is finished, some change will be made in the interior as the present number of boxes are insufficient to meet the requirements.—J.

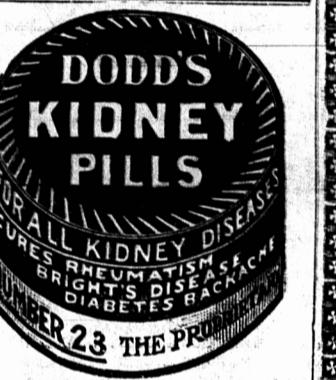

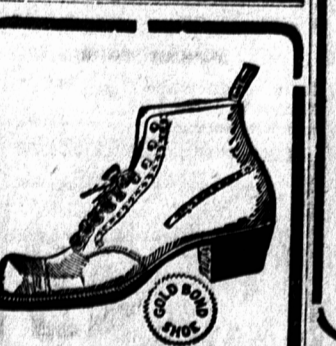
(Continued from page two) meaning public officials.

Just now when Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick are all improving and strengthening their laws against the liquor traffic, it seems to us very regrettable that a reactionary movement should be allowed in this Province and that the sympathetic and co-operative action of the Government apparent a year ago should be strangely absent when requests are made for what we were promised and what would certainly without any injustice to any one, make the law really effective. We can hardly conceive that the different officers of the law would have proved so sympathetic to offenders, or that after such serious charges were made against them by the Alliance they would have been allowed so long to continue in office, or that the Government on the plea of want of time would have refused the amendments we asked for and which we understand were promised to us a year ago, if the purposes of the Government was an impartial enforcement of the law.
