The meeting of the Maritime Stock Breeders Association in Charlottetown on the 28th and 29th inst. will afford an excellent opportunity for the farmers and stockmen of the Island to meet with some of the most prominent, and successful farmers and stock-raisers of the other provinces, and hear them discuss the methods by which they have attained success in their calling. We live to learn, and other men's experience, who are engaged in the same line of business as we are, is always valuable to us. Let the farmers—all who possibly can get together at these meetings, and get acquainted with the brother farmers of Ontario, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

Such prominent agriculturists as Hon. Sydney Fisher, Hon. John Dryden, J. H. Cradale, T. G. Raynor, and F. W. Hodson, of Ontario, to say nothing of the great number of prominent breeders of live stock from each of the Maritime Provinces should be sufficient to draw an audience that will fill the Opera House to overflowing. Mr. F. W. Hodson has been very successful in organizing the agricultural interests of Ontario, and comes here in his capacity of Dominion Live Stock Commissioners to get acquainted with our farmers and stockmen and to find out what can be done in the way of organization and co-operation to further their interests. This will also be a good opportunity to bring our agricultural wants to the notice of the Minister of Agriculture, who will in all probability be at the head of the Department of Agriculture for the next four years. In this Island agriculture is almost our sole dependence, and stock raising is now the principle part of it. What we farmers need more than anything else now is education along the lines of stock breeding, a knowledge of how to breed up a select herd, that is suitable for the particular line in which we are engaged—be it dairying or beef raising. There is perhaps no one way in which farmers loose so much, as by keeping individual animals in their herds that are not and cannot, pay the cost of their keep on account of not being suited to the work they are kept for. Now that most of the farmers revenue comes from his stock, it is of the greatest importance that only such cattle as pay a profit over and above their feed should be kept. At the above meeting we will hear discussions on breeding, and feeding from men who have been successful in selecting and getting together some of the most profitable herds of cattle in Canada.

Don't let the local elections take all your attention or time, but reserve the 28th and 29th for the Stock Breeders meeting which ought to have at least as much interest for you as local politics.
