ACTUALLY MADE A HIT

Hub Perdue Performed This Unbelievable Feat Once in Career

"Hub" Perdue once made a two-base hit. It happened in 1906. The amazing discovery was made by one of our Southern contemporaries. There are thousands and thousands and millions of persons who are of the opinion that the onetime Brave and Cardinals' pitcher never even made a single, but facts are facts. One must give "Hub" credit when he's got it coming to him.

In May, 1906, "Hub" was with the Hopkinsville, Ky., team in the Kitty League. It played Vincennes. Along about the fifth inning "Hub's" turn came to bat. He closed his eyes, swung—and a crash was heard. "Hub" opened his eyes, saw the ball shooting on a line for the fence and ran—as far as second base. NEW ITALIAN BREAD

Marvelous Qualities Are Claimed For New Invention

A marvellous new bread has been invented in Rome. It is called "natural bread." From 660 pounds of grain, 880 pounds of the new bread can be produced. The grain is sifted and washed, then left for from forty-eight to sixty hours in a warm bath where it germinates and sprouts a little. It is then crushed in a special machine and made into dough, which is baked. The product is greyish in color, with a fine odor, and has much higher nutritive qualities than ordinary bread. It is also preferred by the Italians for its taste and digestibility.

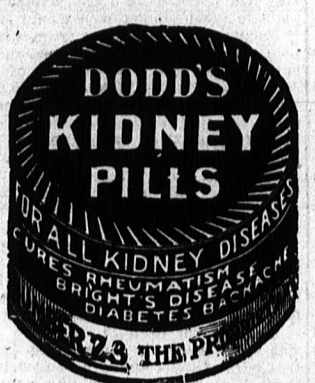

HOW TO MIX CONCRETE

Complete Direction Compiled For Use of Farmers

Concrete is entering more and more into farm construction. As the permanency of the material depends entirely on the proper mixing in the proper proportions of the cement, sand and gravel, the following information will be of interest. The sand, stone, and gravel usually found upon the farms of Canada are generally suitable for concrete construction, provided the following precautions are taken:

1. The aggregate must be free from vegetable matter, dirt, or other foreign substances.
2. When using bank-run gravel, the sand must be separated from the stone or pebbles by screening through a 1/4-inch screen.
3. In small concrete structures, such as drain tile, fence posts, etc., the coarse aggregate (crushed rock or gravel) should range in size from 1/2 inch to 3/4 inch. For larger work, such as silos, barn floors, ordinary foundations, etc., coarse aggregate should range from 1 1/2 inches to 3/4 inch.
4. The sand used should be coarse, hard and clean, and graded from 1/4 inch to fine, with the larger size predominating. Use great care in hand mixing. It is economical to buy a small machine mixer if the farmer intends to use concrete in large quantities.
