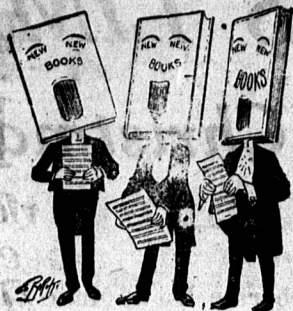

Com. is Named to Investigate Market, Shipping

HARTLAND, N. B., Dec. 11—A committee to work on the matter of stabilizing markets, to regulate shipments and to further advertise New Brunswick products was appointed at a meeting of Saint John river valley potato shippers at Woodville over the week end and a resolution favoring compulsory inspection of potatoes was passed. A delegation of potato shippers

and growers and Board of Trade members will leave here tomorrow for Fredericton, where they will join others active in the potato industry and appear before a meeting of the Provincial Government to ask that steps be taken by the Government to remedy the present serious situation and to improve conditions in the industry for the future. A regular steamship service to Cuba will be among the requests to be put before the government by the delegation. (Canadian Press) LONDON, Dec. 14—A radio message received by Lloyd's today said that all hands had been removed from the liner Celtic which is on the rocks at the entrance to Cork harbor. The skeleton crew which

had been left aboard was taken off during the night because of rough weather. A radio message from a special officer aboard the salvage steamer Restorer, said that there was an increase in a gale which had been blowing from the south-east and that this and the heavy sea made it impossible for any craft to remain alongside.
